Senators Hunt For Counsel In McCarthy, Army Fight

WASHINGTON (AP)—Investigating senators resumed today the quest for an impartial special counsel to handle a probe into charges exchanged by Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) and high Army officials. Selection of a counsel has been holding up the start of public hearings voted March 16. Samuel B. Sears, the Boston trial lawyer hired for the post April 1, resigned yesterday after questions had been raised about whether he could be completely neutral. He insisted he could be, but he quit, he said, because he "would not want the credibility of the proceedings to be handicapped from the very outset by any alleged word, deed or commitment that I might have uttered in the past." He told a news conference there had been "a grievous misunderstanding." He said he was thinking only of McCarthy's current row with the Army officials when he declared last Thursday, the day he took the job, that he never had taken a stand publicly or privately on the subject of McCarthy or "McCarthyism." He said he was not trying to ignore or conceal earlier public declarations praising McCarthy for a

"great job" of fighting Communists. His departure made it almost certain the Senate investigations subcommittee would not meet its target date of next Monday for the opening of televised hearings into the dispute between Army officials and the subcommittee chairman, McCarthy. Sen. Mundt (R-SD), who will run the probe as acting chairman, announced "at least one" more lawyer from outside Washington will be interviewed by the subcommittee during the day as a possible special counsel. Sen. McClellan of Arkansas, the subcommittee's senior Democratic member, told reporters "I don't think it's improbable" that the post would be filled today. He declined to elaborate. McClellan said one of those being considered for the job was Lucius E. Burch Jr. of Memphis. He told the Memphis Commercial Appeal that Burch, a Democrat, was among some 50 attorneys originally suggested for the position. Burch said last night he had no plans to visit Washington in the near future. Mundt disclosed late yesterday the subcommittee had asked the Supreme Court about the propriety of having a federal judge take the counsel post, and that the justices unanimously advised against such a step. He said Chief Justice Warren reported "they felt it would establish a dangerous precedent which would not be in the best public interest." The bid would have gone to Judge Harold Medina of the 2nd U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals if the justices had approved the idea, Mundt said.

Airport Fund Bill Submitted

WASHINGTON (AP)—A military public works bill proposing \$896,976,600 worth of construction authorization was submitted to Congress Tuesday by the Defense Department.

The total includes \$110,325,000 for radar warning and aircraft control installations of the continental defense system.

Projects set out in the bill include: OREGON: Air Force—Klamath Falls Airport, \$4,133,000 and Portland International Airport, \$1,722,000.

WASHINGTON: Army—Ft. Lewis, \$10,951,000. Navy—Naval Air Station, Whidbey Island, \$4,245,000.

Woman Engineer Honored by Group

CHICAGO (AP)—Dr. Lillian Moller Gilbreth, 75, engineer, author and educator, tonight will receive the annual Washington Award from the Western Society of Engineers.
