

IFYE Program Needs Told

Farm families who will open their homes to International Farm Youth Exchanges are being sought according to Francis Skinner, Klamath County 4-H extension agent.

Through the exchange about eight young visitors from other countries will spend part of the year in Oregon, he stated.

A young New Zealand Dairy farmer is the first to be assigned for an Oregon visit this year. He is John Matthew Whitlock, 23, from Kairanga New Zealand. The farm homes at which he will stay have not yet been selected.

The International Farm Youth Exchange gives overseas young people, 18 to 28 years of age, a chance to see how Americans live. They live, work and play with farm families.

For each delegate Oregon sends to some other country, two exchanges spend two to three months in this state. Each of these

foreign visitors will also spend some time in another state before returning home.

Mrs. Winnifred Gillen, state 4-H extension agent heading the IFYE program in Oregon, said each exchange will probably have an opportunity to stay with two or three different farm families while here. By this arrangement, they will stay from four to six weeks with each family, working with them for room and board.

Additional information and application forms for those interested in providing a temporary home for a visitor may be obtained at the county extension office, in the post office building, or phone 8151, Skinner added.

Grand Jury Session Set

Klamath County Grand Jury will go into session again Monday to reconsider two criminal cases resubmitted under orders from Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg.

The defendants involved are Raymond J. Bodinet, accused of complicity in a parlor house robbery; January 8 during which his accomplice, Edwin Coyle, was killed by a policeman, and Alfred Junior Carter, charged with manslaughter.

Carter is accused of slaying Cruz Unzueta in front of the Pastime Pool Hall on Christmas Eve.

The Bodinet case was resubmitted by Judge Vandenberg after Defense Attorney A. C. Yaden filed a demurrer to the previous indictment. The Carter case was resubmitted at the request of District Attorney Frank Alderson.

Thirteen witnesses have been subpoenaed to appear before the grand jury.

The matter was turned over to the executive committee for study to determine what angles might be involved.

Kuykendall. The Kuykendalls reported that they will offer competition in the races with their very fine Logan strain homers. Dr. and Mrs. G. A. Massey attended the meeting as interested observers. The club welcomes visitors at any time.

Action was taken by the club on two important matters. One: On the invitation of David Buscall the records of outstanding performances in the races will be sent to the American Union of Racing Pigeon Fanciers - Merit Prize System Committee for consideration for nation wide awards. Two: On the invitation of Mrs. Helyn Brancato, Hawthorne, California. The records of merit will be sent to the All American Committee, of which Mrs. Brancato is a member, for consideration for the All American awards of the year. The All American Committee is comprised of members of both the American Union and the International Federation of Homing Pigeon Fan-

ciers. Winners of All American awards will be the top pigeon performers of the entire United States. Letters pledging the club's participation in the two events have been mailed to Buscall and Mrs. Brancato.

Braman expressed his desire that a concourse be formed and that the center be here in Klamath Falls as there is a good prospect of a new club in the Grants Pass, Medford, Ashland area. The advantage of a concourse would be that the two clubs could fly in competition with each other by both shipping to the same liberating point at the same time. Inasmuch as the several cities are very much in a line across the southern part of Oregon the competition should be interesting to say the least.
