

Tracy, After Long Layoff, Back at Original Studio

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Spencer Tracy, doing his first loanout in 15 years, is happy to be back at the studio where he says he was once fired.

Tracy, long a member of the MGM star team, is doing "Broken Lance" for 20th Century-Fox. The price for his services is probably around \$150,000. But that's not the reason for his satisfaction. A couple of decades ago, when the studio was just plain Fox, he was under contract there.

"They fired me," he said. "Those were the days when I was still drinking, and I got drunk now and then. But never on a picture—always between. Anyway, they worried."

"I was all set for a big, expensive picture. But they came to me and asked if I was going to behave. I told them, 'That's a heck of a way to get me to behave! If you're worried about me, why don't you let me go?'"

"That's all they needed. 'I wasn't a box office star or anything, and they were happy to see me go. I was out of the studio the same day.'"

"But one thing pleased me about the whole affair. At 8 o'clock that night, my agent took me over to MGM to have a talk with Louis B. Mayer. At 9 o'clock I was signed to a contract, and I've been there ever since."

The rest, of course, is Hollywood history. Within three years, Tracy had won two Oscars for "Captains Courageous" and "Boy's Town." His former bosses at Fox must have been burning.

"But they had the last word," Tracy admitted. "Somebody discovered that I still owed the studio a picture. So I went back and did 'Stanley and Livingstone' in 1939."

Tracy, who ranks with beer as one of Milwaukee's most notable products, is still going strong, having turned 54 last week. His hair is white, but he still has his youthful bounce and lively sense of humor.

There had been reports that he would be leaving MGM, along with Clark Gable, Greer Garson and other long-time stars. Tracy is now one of the longest last stars on the lot. He said:

"Will I sign again? I don't know. At first I didn't think I would because I didn't think they wanted me. Nobody said anything about staying. I think that's why a lot of actors leave."

"But we have started having talks, and something may come of it. I still have three pictures to make for them. After that, who knows?"

Basin Area Hobby Show Rules Outlined; Biggest Event to Date Expected

Rules and regulations for the third annual Klamath Basin Hobby Show have been announced by Paul Campbell, YMCA director.

The show, sponsored by the 20-30 Club of Klamath Falls and the YMCA, will be held April 22, 23 and 24 at the "Y".

Rules follow:
(1) Both children and adults may exhibit.

(2) Entry blanks must be received by the Board of Directors not later than Thursday, April 22, at 2 p.m. to be eligible for judging. Exhibits must be in the hands of the board Thursday, April 22, by 4 p.m. The YMCA will not be open

to the general public then but will be open to exhibitors and workers to allow the exhibits to be set up.

(3) All competing collections must be owned by the exhibitor.

(4) All handicraft exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor.

(5) Persons may enter as many exhibits as desired. A separate entry blank must be made for each exhibit. All articles will be given every possible care, and guards will be on duty night and day.

(6) The following awards will be offered: (a) Ribbons for first, second and third places in each group and class; (b) Honorable mention where warranted.

(7) Judges will be decidedly influenced by the neatness and attractiveness of display or mounting, and whenever possible exhibits of small objects should be neatly boxed or displayed under glass, cellophane, etc.

(8) Entry blanks may be delivered in person or mailed to the YMCA at 722 Pine Street, Klamath Falls.

(9) All entries must be accompanied by the exhibitor or his agent.

(10) While the committee will maintain special supervision the entire duration of the show and will take every reasonable precaution to insure the safety of exhibits, yet it must be understood the owners are required to assume all risk and should any exhibit be injured, lost or stolen, the Board of Directors will render all possible assistance in recovery of same, but will not recognize any claim for payment of the value or portion thereof.

(11) All entries will be considered by the Board of Directors; however, they do reserve the right to close the entries in an particular group when the limit of accommodations has been reached.

(12) Exhibits may be claimed from the hours of 4 to 6 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. Saturday, April 24. The Board of Directors will not be responsible for exhibits left after the above limit. Claim checks must be presented when claiming exhibits.

(13) Should any question arise not provided for in the rules and regulations the decision of the Board of Directors will be final.

(14) All entries must be plainly marked with exhibitor's name and address.

Royal Arch Masons were to elect officers Wednesday and the meeting was to close Thursday with installation of officers.

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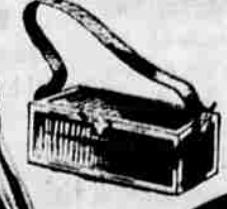
