

### Oregon Farmers Compete In Soil Conservation Deal

For the first time Oregon farmers and ranchers will compete in an annual soil conservation awards program, according to the Good-year Tire and Rubber Company, Akron, Ohio, sponsor of the program. The program currently is in its seventh year in a number of states, but Oregon farmers will

compete for the first time. The outstanding farmer from the Oregon district selected as best in the competition and one member of the first place district governing body of the state will be awarded with a vacation trip to Arizona in December, as guests of the donor. They will also receive, at the regional meeting of the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts this year, bronze plaques as a permanent symbol of their achievements in conservation.

Competition in the current program ends on April 30 and names of winners selected by the judges will be announced from Akron, in July.

Two local soil districts, the Klamath SCD and Langell Valley SCD, are working hard in an attempt to have a winner from their areas.

Five Oregon men have been selected as judges for this state; they are: Robert C. Baum, executive secretary, State Soil Conservation Committee, chairman, and E. P. Jackman, extension farm crops specialist, both of Oregon State

### Tots Die In Refrigerator

HILL AIR FORCE BASE, Utah (AP) — A pair of roller skates was found lying in the doorway of a vacant Wherry housing unit apartment Wednesday night at Utah's Hill Air Force Base.

A neighbor, Howard Bell, went into the empty apartment to investigate. In the kitchen, he found a little girl's sweater. He also noticed that the shelves of the apartment's refrigerator had been removed. He opened the ice box door.

Inside, sitting upright on the floor of the refrigerator, were the bodies of Joyce Mullis, 6, and her 5-year-old sister, Donna.

Both had been dead of suffocation for some time after apparently climbing into the refrigerator and closing the door behind them.

The discovery climaxed a search at Hill Field which had lasted for almost six hours. The girls, daughters of S.Sgt. and Mrs. Ray Mullis, disappeared about 3 p.m. Wednesday.

### Klamath Gets OLCC Funds

Klamath county's five incorporated cities will share this month in a quarterly liquor revenue distribution being allocated to 213 Oregon cities by the state liquor control commission.

Klamath Falls will receive \$519,055; Chiloquin \$232,226; Bonanza \$200,031; Malin \$205,841; Merrill \$200,321.

Total distribution to cities amounts to \$300,000, representing five per cent of \$6,000,000 liquor revenue available for distribution for the three months ending March 31, according to the commission, which allocated the money according to population. The general fund of the state received the remaining \$5,700,000.

The OLCC also is distributing \$180,665 from purchaser's permits

sold during January, February and March. The general fund will receive \$90,333.53 and incorporated cities a similar amount.

Of the permit revenue, Klamath Falls will receive \$1650.73, Chiloquin \$69.46; Bonanza \$24.88; Malin \$61.56 and Merrill \$48.83.

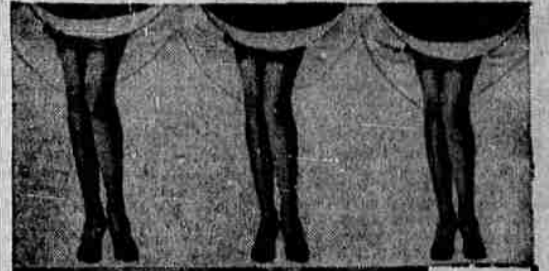
