Ike To Hear Dulles Report On Pacific Defense Pact

AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP) — President Eisenhower will get a personal report from Secretary of State Dulles here Monday on United States efforts to forge a Pacific defense alliance to stem the spread of communism.

The President's vacation headquarters announced late yesterday that Dulles, just back from London and Paris conferences on Indochina and Southeast Asia, will fly from Washington to meet Eisenhower.

The announcement came a few hours after Dulles had returned to the United States after winning British and French agreement to work toward a Pacific pact.

James C. Hagerly, White House press secretary, said that Dulles—in addition to reporting on the London-Paris negotiations—will "obtain the President's guidance on the upcoming NATO conference and the Geneva conference."

He will spend two or three hours with Eisenhower at the Little White House at the Augusta National Golf Club, then return to Washington. He will fly Tuesday night to Paris for a meeting of North Atlantic Treaty nations, then go on to Geneva, Switzerland, for a Big Four foreign ministers conference starting April 26.

Representatives of Communist China will sit in at the Geneva sessions, but not as participants, together with U. S., British, French and Russian officials.

Dulles said on his return to this country yesterday that he was well satisfied with the outcome of his London and Paris talks aimed at creation of a 10-nation Pacific alliance similar to the North Atlantic collective security agreement.

He termed the situation in Indochina and the rest of Southeast Asia disastrous, and added that the "disaster would be compounded" if Indochina were lost eventually to the Reds.

Yesterday Eisenhower dispatched a message praising the kingdom of Laos in Indochina for its "inspiring defense against foreign aggression."

The presidential message was on the occasion of Laos King Sisavang Vong's 50th anniversary as monarch. Eisenhower congratulated the King and added:

"I wish at the same time to express my hope that the people of Laos will continue for many years to benefit from your wise and courageous leadership which has been so vital a factor in the inspiring defense of your kingdom against foreign aggression."

The President and Mrs. Eisenhower were joined at his Easter holiday headquarters last night by their son John, an Army major stationed at Ft. Benning, Ga., his wife Barbara and their three children—David, 6, Barbara Anne, 4, and Susan, 2.

Timber Sold For Big Price

ABERDEEN (AP) — A 700-acre stand of timber in the Matieny Creek watershed was sold to Rayonier Inc. Wednesday for \$318,650—8 1/2 times the minimum appraised value of \$36,126.

The timber, in an area known as the Grays Harbor community-type sustained-yield working circle, was offered at a public auction.

Arnold Polson of Hoquiam gave oral notice of protest of the sale. He told Jack Heintzleman, district forest ranger from Quinalt, that most firms were at a disadvantage since Rayonier has not made its logging railroad into a common carrier.

Involved in the sale was 19,800,000 board feet of timber. However, the total stand in the area totals nearly 47 million board feet. Reappraisals, for continued cutting, are scheduled in 1956 and 1958.

Eight firms offered sealed bids before the sale. Then the bidding started and lasted two hours.

Final figures in the Rayonier offer were \$14 a thousand for 760,000 board feet of cedar, \$29 for 240,000 feet of Douglas fir, \$14.70 for 200,000 feet of spruce and \$16 for 18,800,000 feet of hemlock and other species.

In addition, the firm will pay planting and slash disposal deposits totaling 80 cents a thousand.
