1954 Water Conditions In West Said Generally Good

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Interior McKay reported Friday that water conditions for the impending crop year are "generally good in all parts of the West" except in the Rio Grande River Basin and other east-south-west sections. "Some spot areas in other basins have a poor outlook, notably the Umatilla and Baker projects in Oregon, the North Platte project in Wyoming and Nebraska, and the Angostura Reservoir in South Dakota," McKay said. "In some other areas, the runoff from this winter's snow will be light but there is sufficient hold-over in storage reservoirs to insure an adequate water supply for the summer."

Rose Officials Seek Ruling

PORTLAND (AP) — The Portland Rose Festival Parade Committee, hoping to get at least 50 floats in the annual parade June 12, appealed to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission Thursday to allow liquor interests to enter floats this year. The commission took no immediate action, but George Woodworth, commission attorney, said such action would violate existing regulations restricting advertising of breweries and distilleries. William Baillie, commission administrator, said it might establish a precedent that would allow the liquor interests to enter floats in fairs and rodeos throughout the state. The parade committee said, however, that the floats should not be considered advertising, but a public relations and community service function.
