

Benson Warns Spud Growers

Potato growers have again been cautioned by Secretary of Agriculture Benson to adjust their 1954 production plans realistically if they are to avoid marketing trouble.

"A year ago at this time," he said, "the intentions-to-plant report indicated that growers were proposing to plant too many potatoes in 1953. On March 27 we issued a strong appeal to potato growers to take another look at their 'intentions' and make the necessary adjustments. We pointed out that production greatly in excess of needs would be certain to result in lower farm returns. I am repeating that warning now, and also calling attention to the fact that substantial compliance with the announced acreage guides will be a condition of eligibility for any diversion assistance on the 1954 crop."

Mr. Benson warned that potato growers should not be misled into easing up on their adjustment plans because of the promotion program and diversion action announced on March 24.

SP Publication Describes Care Given Spud Shipments

"Pacific Fruit Express refrigerator cars literally turn on the heat to protect the cold-weather movement of thousands of carloads of Klamath potatoes during one of the most unusual of the many 'rushes' that keep Southern Pacific and PFE forces busy in the agricultural west," states the lead feature story in the April issue of the Southern Pacific Bulletin.

Bill Jennings, assistant editor of The Bulletin, and Gene Wright, staff photographer for the publication, spent a full day in the Klamath Basin some weeks ago to gather material for this feature story on Basin spuds.

Assisting the team with background and spot information were County Agent Walt Jendracek, Ross Aubrey, chief inspector, and Troy Qualls, president of the Klamath growers association.

The two and a half page story carries pictures of grading, loading and inspecting potatoes and an interesting shot of the interior of one of the spud cars showing the oil heater which provides the right interior temperature for winter shipments of potatoes.

The history of the growth of the potato raising industry in the Basin was touched upon, starting with the first commercial growing which began in 1918 when 230 acres grossed about \$3,500. The 1953-54 harvest, from approximately 20,000 acres, was valued at about \$18 1/2 million.

Even the "State of Jefferson" theory, with Klamath Falls as the capital of this high desert empire, was explained briefly in the article.

PARIS, (M) — A French news agency dispatch from Hanoi quoted a French officer Friday as saying "in certain units, nearly 50 per cent of the effectives have volunteered to be parachuted into Dien Bien Phu."

The volunteers include non-commissioned officers and French and African soldiers now fighting in the Red River Delta. None of them have been trained as paratroopers.

The officer said they volunteered following a request for reinforcements for the beleaguered garrison, and those selected will be given a hurry-up paratroop training.

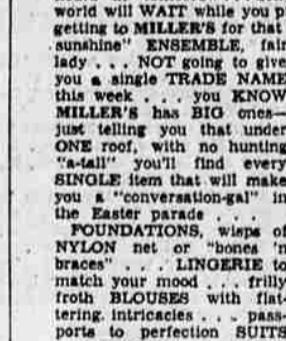
