Modoc Forest Survey Told

The measurement of the three snow courses on the South Fork District of the Modoc National Forest has been completed by district personnel, Don Euler, Harold Hunter, and Walt Broadhurst. All three courses showed an increase in the depth of snow over the same period last year, and Blue Lake and Eagle Peak courses also showed an increase in water content. Following is a summary of the findings:

Cedar Pass: 42.0 inches average depth of snow and 14.4 inches average water content, an increase of .8 inch snow and a decrease of 2.3 inches water (over same period last year).

Blue Lake: 29.7 inches average snow depth and 10.3 inches average water content, an increase of 5.6 inches snow and an increase of .2 inch water (over same period last year).

Eagle Peak: 43.2 inches average snow depth and 15.5 inches average water content, an increase of 3.6 inches of snow and an increase of .7 inches water (over same period last year).
