### KF Humane Drive Slated

A drive for new members by Klamath County Humane Society will be launched May 2 in connection with the annual observance of Be Kind to Animals Week.

Dr. Harry Leonard, president of the society, said Wednesday that the work of the organization has been greatly expanded and new members are needed to carry on the program.

"For years this work has been done by a few persons whose love of humanity extends into the animal kingdom," Dr. Leonard explained.

"Animals, from porcupines to horses, have been rescued from distress and abuse by the society," Dr. Leonard continued. "Dogs have been either returned to distracted owners or, when possible, found good homes. Cats have been relieved of suffering when necessary."

"The Klamath County Humane Society needs greater support from the public in general," he added. "Funds for the organization's work are meager. Available funds are made up of donations and a small contribution from the state of Oregon. During Be Kind to Animals Week which starts May 2 and ends May 9, we hope to enroll many new members."

Other officers of the organization are: U.S. Balentine, vice president and Mrs. Annabell Newton, secretary treasurer. The board of directors includes Ida Odell, Murray Britton and Roland Wright.

General Electric Stock Split Told

SCHENECTADY, N.Y. (AP) — A management proposal to split General Electric Co. common stock three shares for one has gained overwhelming approval of the firm's stockholders.

Owners of 22,371,152 shares voted in favor of the conversion at GE's annual meeting here Tuesday. Owners of 56,000 shares voted against the split, which will lower the stock's cost per share.

GE has about 250,000 stockholders.

### OLCC Reminds License Holders

Licensees of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission were reminded this week that they are prohibited by law from making any contribution to any candidate for political office or to any political party.

Administrator W. H. Baillie also cited an opinion from the attorney general dated October 11, 1951, which interprets the law as prohibiting any licensee to allow a candidate to post placards in any part of the licensed premises. Licensees also are prohibited from allowing distribution or circulation on licensed premises of campaign material, circulars, pamphlets, buttons, match folders or the like advocating a candidate's election to public office and campaign literature may not be placed on the premises for the availability of the patron.

Nor does the law allow licensees to circulate political petitions on the premises to obtain signatures to place the name of a candidate for office or a controversial measure on the election ballot. According to the opinion, licensees are prohibited from performing on the premises any such service on behalf of any candidate or political party.

"The attorney general's opinion holds that it was the intent of the legislature to restrain and avoid any activity on licensed premises which would aid or assist one candidate against another," Baillie said, "and the commission must enforce the law accordingly."

### Ike Plans Speech Series

AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP) — President Eisenhower has decided to prolong his vacation here, after an interruption tomorrow and Friday for a series of speeches.

The President's headquarters announced late yesterday that he will fly back to Augusta Friday night from Kentucky. Indications when he arrived here April 13 were that the vacation would end tomorrow.

Eisenhower will leave by plane tomorrow afternoon for Washington where he will make a quick trip to Constitution Hall to talk informally at the annual convention of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Immediately after the talk he will fly on to New York for a address at a night meeting of the American Newspaper Publishers Association.

Friday morning he will fly from Washington to Kentucky where he will:

- (1) review the tank command at Ft. Knox;
- (2) visit Abraham Lincoln's birthplace cabin at Hodgenville and speak briefly at Lincoln memorial building ceremonies;
- (3) speak at Transylvania College's 175th convocation at Lexington.

James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, said Eisenhower has decided to return to Augusta from Lexington Friday night instead of going back to Washington.
