School Bond Issue Voted

MACDOEL — The elementary school district bond issue and the accompanying proposal to accept state aid in building a new school building received 70 affirmative votes and four negative votes in Tuesday's election.

As explained at the last school board meeting by W. E. Roberts, county school superintendent, \$41,000 is the maximum amount the

district can tax itself under the California five per cent limitation. Assessed valuation of the district is \$825,755. The state law allows the allocation of state funds to make up the difference needed in the event the voters ask for them and vote the maximum bond issue. State aid will amount to \$120,000. The proposed new building will have three classrooms, a common

room, office and restrooms. The present building is nearly 50 years old and inadequate for the increasing enrollment of students.

Howard R. Perrin, Klamath Falls, is architect for the proposed structure.
