Weiser Meets Brown

Saturday night's boxing card will be headlined by what could very well be the Oregon State Lightweight Championship fight, when Little Papa Brown tangles with Ralph Weiser, in a ten round main event.

Little Papa has compiled an outstanding boxing record during his ring campaign, and included in his wins is one over the "Beatty Bomber," Weiser.

Brown met Weiser in Portland last fall, and registered a decision over the Basin lightweight, who has two fists loaded with plenty of punch.

In four fights with Blackie Vandermere, Little Papa holds a win and three draws, which shows his boxing ability.

Last week's fight against Frankie Rodgers, in Portland, Brown turned in a knockout verdict, and sent Rodgers to the hospital with a broken jaw.

Weiser on the other hand needs no explanation to the local ring fans. He has displayed plenty of boxing and punching savvy in his past showings at the Armory.

In the last Armory battle, Weiser met Al Moore, of San Francisco, and was puzzled as to Moore's style of fighting. Not only was Weiser stymied but the fans watched with spots of laughter, at the Californian, who proved to be quite a ring clown.

Weiser was awarded a draw with Moore, who completely out-reached the Indian pugilist.

The semi-windup will feature Rudy Carlson and Derrill Harrington, in a six rounder that should give the Armory fans plenty of boxing excitement before the main event.

Both of these fighters have made numerous appearances in the local spotlights, and are not new to the Basin boxing fans.

In another six round special that Promoter Mack Lillard has lined up for the Saturday night card will be George Bray facing Ted Hall, of Seattle.

Bray made a tremendous hit with the fans in a six round preliminary bout to the Jimmy Bryne-Rodger Smith battle earlier this month, and the fans are expecting him to continue his showing.

In a four rounder Bob Barney, of Beatty, and Al Cobb, the third Seattle fighter on the card, will fight it out if it goes the full distance.

Both fighters have a knockout punch and have shown it in their past few fights. Barney posted a KO victory in his last appearance at the armory, and Cobb recently set Portland afire with his showings in the City of Roses boxing circles.

In the opener two Chiloquin lightweights will supply the action. Plumie Wright and Duane McDaniel will meet in the four rounder, and has the aspects of being a top notch opener for the local fans.

Brad Lucas, Cavemen pitcher, held the Klamath squad to two hits, both of which were scratch safeties, in the first contest. In the second game errors and the inability to move baserunners around the base paths proved to be fatal for the Pelicans opening series.

Klamath will probably start the same lineup that has been used the greater part of the season. Bill Hambling will probably be working at first base, and either Eddie Bigby or Gene Meiler will hold down the thirdbase position.

The keystone combination can be readily supplied with Don Dexter at short and Ron Conner at second. There is a possibility that the Pel infielders may be changed in one of tomorrow's games.

The three outfielders will be chosen from Larry Yarnell, David Leeling, Craig McCarty and Don Taucher. Any three of these outfielders could supply the needed batting punch to put the Pelicans back into the district race.

Modesto Jimenez and Bob Kelly will probably share the catching duties in the afternoon games at Recreation Field.

Starting pitchers for the Pels will be Dave D'Olivo and Garry Williams, with relief help, either coming from Jimenez or Earl Tichenor.
