Steelhead Trapping Shows Beaver Creek Still Used

Two of Oregon's steelhead recently picked up in a game commission trap have shown that one formerly much used spawning area is still being used by the migratory rainbows.

The fish were trapped on Beaver creek near the town of Paulina in central Oregon. This trap was installed on March 22 to determine the extent of steelhead migration to the upper Crooked River tributaries. It is located almost 100 miles above the town of Prineville, and when the fish were trapped they were in good condition and still bright and shiny indicating they were still not ready to stop and spawn. The fish had already traveled over 450 miles from the Pacific, and when released continued on upstream.

This area of the Crooked River drainage was formerly an important steelhead spawning area, but various uses of the water have decreased its value. Work is being done by the game commission to improve this and other tributaries to the Deschutes River and thus maintain and improve the fish runs on this world famous steelhead stream.

Last year, game commission agent M. L. Montgomery, found further use of the stream system when he trapped and released migrating steelhead above Steelhead Falls on the main Deschutes, a region that many doubted was in use by the fish.
