Hobby Show Includes Entomologist's Display

All bugs are insects, but all insects aren't bugs; a fact not always realized by the average home gardener.

Joe Schuh, local entomologist, pointed out this and many other interesting facts on his hobby, part of which he will display at the 20-30 Club-YMCA Hobby Show now in progress.

Schuh began 25 years ago collecting insects in Oregon, and now has more than 50,000 individuals of about 5,000 varieties, all mounted in glass trays. The insects range in size from one sixteenth of an inch to two and a half or three inches in length.

The "all bugs are insects but all insects aren't bugs" statement needs clarification, Schuh pointed out that insects are divided into 25 common orders according to living habits, and these are further divided into families, genera and individual, for classification.

Only one order of insects are bugs. True bugs, Schuh said, are sucking insects and have a triangular pattern on their backs. But all sucking insects aren't bugs — flies, fleas and lice are sucking insects but they aren't bugs!

Schuh named some of the more commonly known orders as fleas, dragon flies, bees, butterflies and moths, grasshoppers and crickets, earwigs. Some of them are good and some are bad.

Schuh uses his extensive knowledge of insects and insecticides for advice to farmers.

"Aphids on potatoes probably cause the most economic loss," said Schuh. "You can't see the damage at the time, but the after effects are very harmful," and he added that brownling in potatoes is a disease spread by aphids.

Also harmful are lygus on clover and mosquitoes, which cause loss of blood in cattle and indirectly cause loss of weight by nestering them and keeping them from feeding. Mosquitoes, too, are definitely harmful, and sometimes preventive to recreation, especially in mountainous areas.

"Mosquitoes can be controlled, though," Schuh observed, "but it takes funds, interest, and trained persons. The important thing is to do a thorough job; otherwise, especially with home gardeners, you can do more harm than good."
