Spud Freight Rates Reduced

Klamath Basin shippers are now able to move potatoes by rail into the Los Angeles area on reduced freight rates, according to G. W. (Bud) Morgan, district agent for the Southern Pacific.

The new rate, on a 40,000 pound minimum weight basis, is 62 cents per hundred. Formerly the rate was 67.8.

Effective Thursday, April 22, the reduced rate affects the entire Klamath Basin on both major railroads, and includes shipping points on the O.C. and E., as far east as Dalry, with the exception of Macdoel and Dorris in Butte Valley. Shipments from these two points are classed as intrastate shipments and the rates controlled by the California Railroad Commission. The 62 cents rate will apply to the Butte Valley points starting May 8.

The reduced rate is on potatoes and applies only to Los Angeles and nearby points using the Los Angeles rate, Morgan stated.

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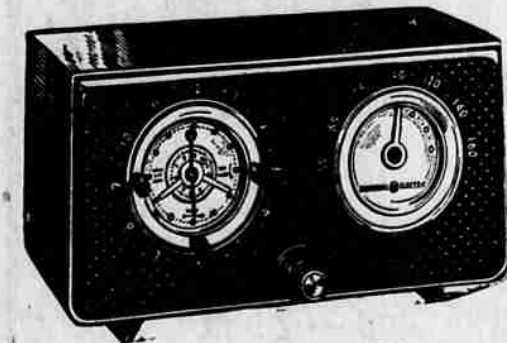
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
