New Flight Honored

An official air mail cachet has been approved by the Post Office Department for United Air Lines in conjunction with inauguration of the first non-stop transcontinental DC-7 service between San Francisco and New York June 1.

Designed for first day collectors, the cachet features a drawing of United's new six-mile-a-minute DC-7s which will operate daily between California and the East Coast.

Collectors should send first flight cover requests to the San Francisco Postmaster and District 8, San Francisco 6, California. Dispatch from the air mail field at San Francisco must be prepaid at the appropriate air mail postage rate. Double postal cards intended for return purposes will not be acceptable as first class covers.

All covers should be accompanied by a letter authorizing the holding of the cachet to be mailed on the inaugural flight on June 1. Space approximately 2 1/2 x 2 1/2 inches to the left of the address side of all covers is required.

Upon termination of the inaugural flight, covers bearing the cachet will be backstamped and forwarded to addressees.
