## Library Group Meet Planned

"Oregon Libraries in Action" will be the theme of the annual convention of the Oregon Library Association to be held in Corvallis on April 30 and May 1. Stewart Holbrook, noted Oregon author, will be the featured speaker at the banquet session Friday evening.

Governor Paul L. Patterson and members of the Board of Trustees of the Oregon State Library will be the honored guests. Evelyn Cooper, librarian at the Klamath County Library and OLA vice-president, will be toastmaster.

State Senator Robert D. Holmes of Gearhart will speak on the topic, "Favorable Legislation, How Do We Get It?" at the Friday afternoon luncheon meeting. Samuel B. Stewart, of the Oregon State Tax Commission, will address the conference members on "Taxation Problems and the Library." The Friday afternoon, "The Library Movement" will be the subject of a panel discussion in which Mrs. Robert Y. Thornton, state president of the AAU, Mrs. Ross Slyter, Oceanside; Mrs. Floyd Edwards, Albany; will be the participants. E. L. Callahan of Corvallis will be the moderator.

Other speakers will include William Carlson, librarian Oregon State System of Higher Education; Dr. Carl Hintz, librarian of the University of Oregon; Donald Nelson, librarian of Eastern Oregon College of Education.

A breakfast meeting will be held for school librarians at 8 a.m. Monday morning. The main business session will feature a discussion of the problem of state assistance for the development of county and regional libraries, said A. A. Whitman, state president.
