WASHINGTON (AP)—Vice President Nixon said Wednesday the major aim of this administration's policy is to avoid committing American troops in Indochina or elsewhere, if possible.

GENEVA (AP)—Red China's Foreign Minister Chou En-Lai demanded Wednesday that all foreign military bases in Asia be abolished and that all foreign troops be withdrawn.
