SP Receives New Cars

First deliveries on an order for 25 new passenger chair cars placed by Southern Pacific last year have just been made, it was announced yesterday by J. H. Pruett Jr., general passenger agent.

The cars embody newest developments for passenger comfort and are for service on the "Shasta Daylight" between San Francisco and Portland; the "Coast Daylight" between San Francisco and Los Angeles; and the transcontinental "City of San Francisco," "Sunset Limited," and "Golden State," Pruett said.

These cars, bringing SP's total post-war passenger equipment expenditures to \$43,000,000, were ordered to fill the increased demand for low-cost rail transportation with about three-fourths of the railroad's passengers now traveling in chair cars and coaches, Pruett explained.

All of the new cars have foam rubber seats adjustable to various positions. Some cars with chaise lounge type leg rests specially designed for sleeping or reclining are for service on trains carrying overnight travelers. Other cars with five-foot wide "sky view" windows are for the "Daylight" trains operating in scenic areas.

Air Force Plans Big Air Game

FF. BRAGG, N. C. (AP)—A fleet of C124 Globemasters prepared to take off from Louisiana today to bring major elements of an infantry division to atomic war games here.

The planes will haul two regimental combat teams — nearly 10,000 men — about 1,000 miles and land them in an airfield seized by the 2nd Airborne Division in the mass drop of 9,000 paratroopers Monday.

Sixty Globemasters, each capable of transporting 200 soldiers, will be used. The airlift is a test of moving troops quickly over long distances for immediate combat.

Maj. Gen. Robert W. Douglas Jr., commander of the 18th Air Force and director of Exercise Tacair 54-7, said yesterday his plans are ready to execute similar missions all over the world should a call come. He added that should developments in Indochina or elsewhere require, the planes could be diverted from maneuvers to overseas operations on short notice.

The airlift between here and Louisiana will be spaced over four days. The planes will go from Donaldson AFB at Greenville, S. C., to Alexandria AFB, La., where 27th Division troops from Camp Polk started marshaling today.

One 27th Division regimental combat team, the 145th, was airlifted here last week at the start of Exercise Flash Burn. This is an Army maneuver training soldiers in atomic warfare defense.

The 145th since has been engaging an "aggressor" force, composed of the 3rd Armored Cavalry
