

Lettermen's Club Schedules Taylor

Tomorrow night, the KUHL lettermen's club will feature Chuck Taylor as guest speaker in their first all-sports banquet that is to be held in Pelican Court.

Taylor is the head football coach at Stanford University and is being brought to Klamath Falls by the lettermen's club.

This is the first time that the K-Club has undertaken such a project for all variety letter winners.

The Stanford coach came within an eyelash of winning the 1953 Pacific Coast Conference Championship, after pre-season dope had considered the Stanford team an outsider looking in as far as championship teams were concerned.

In three years at the California school, Taylor has compiled a record of 20 wins and ten defeats along with one tie, which is a good slate in the Coast Conference.

Last January Taylor piloted the West Shrine team to a crushing

31-7 win over the East team in the annual East-West Shrine game in Kezar Stadium, San Francisco.

One of the most recent honors that was bestowed upon Taylor is his selection to the All-Star coaching staff for the College All-Star Chicago football game this summer.

In Taylor's first year at Stanford he was selected as the "Coach of the Year" after sending his team through a nine straight game winning streak and into the Rose Bowl on New Year's Day, as the Pacific Coast Champion.

His honors gave Stanford the distinction of being one of the universities in the country to have two Coach of the Year awards. Clark Shaughnessy was the other Indian mentor to receive the honor. This was in 1940.

The Redskin coach played football for Stanford in 1929-32 and was a near unanimous choice for all-coast team his last three years and all-American his last playing season.

Taylor is also scheduled to speak at the Rotary Club tomorrow noon at the Willard Hotel.

Oakland and San Diego are giving indication that they intend to stay right up where they are now in the Pacific Coast League standings—first and second place.

Oakland retains a half game margin by reason of an 8-4 win Wednesday night over Los Angeles, its second in a row. San Diego kept pace by downing Portland

5-2 and Sacramento clung to third place with a 5-0 win over Seattle. Hollywood shut out San Francisco 6-0 in the other Wednesday game.

Bill Thomson pitched San Diego to the decision over Portland. He held the Ports to five hits while the Padres were getting nine off four rival fingers. Fletcher Robbe hit a homer in the Portland cause. The Padres bunched five of their hits in the first two innings.

Oakland got down to its player limit Wednesday by disposing of six players. Bo Palica and Rick Bolelio, pitchers, were sent to Modesto; infielders Tony Munoz and Tony Rivas to Wenatchee; pitcher George Stanich and catcher Harry Bartolomei were sent

home to await assignment. Portland released pitcher Fred Sanford, one time New York Yankee, who has had a sore arm all spring.

33 Boxers In AAU Finals

BOSTON (U.S. — Thirty three boxers—including two beaten finalists of the 1953 tournament—battled for 10 titles Thursday night in the windup of the National AAU Championships in Boston Garden.

Back for another try after just missing a year ago are light heavyweight, Warrenell Lester of Bel Air, Md., and the Baltimore team and 132-pounder Norman Johnson of Milwaukee.

Lester—who lost a year ago in the 178-pound final to Frank Perry of Wilberforce, Ohio, the tourney's top performer—is in the round of four with Buddy Turman of Tyler, Texas; Al Shack of Buffalo, N.Y., and Eugene Toft of Columbus, Ohio.

Johnson, a 20-year-old packing plant worker who lost in the 139-pound class windup in 1953, runs up against one of the best boxers in the show in knockout specialist Garnett Hart of Philadelphia.

Hart has stopped his three opponents so far to move into the

final with a record of 51 straight victories.

Two others of the 10 divisions are pared down to two finalists. Jack Puscas of Eugene, Ore., fighting on the Seattle team, meets Buffalo's clever Stan Fitzgerald for the 125-pound crown and New York's Bob Shell faces James Mitchener of Baltimore in the 139-pound title match.

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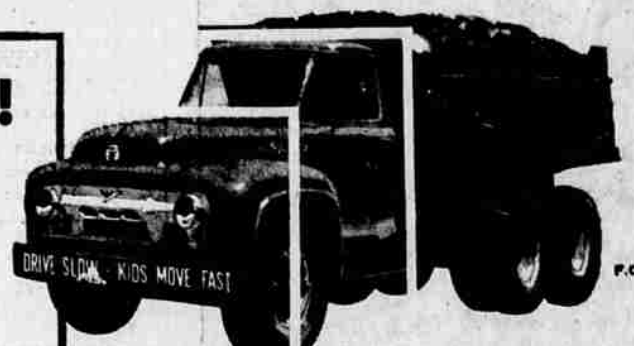
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
