Heavy Rain, Winds Hit Southwest

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP)—An army of small but vicious tornadoes mauled more than a dozen cities and towns in the eastern half of Texas Friday and leaped the Oklahoma line for another strike.

The marauding twisters apparently came closest to producing a disaster at the Little Beniah Community, 12 miles southeast of Lubbock, in east Texas.

At Hugo, Okla., a tornado injured one man, destroyed five houses and damaged at least 100 as it slashed across town in a heavy rain storm.
