

Proclaiming Of Special Weeks Gets Complicated

SALEM (AP) — This business of proclaiming special weeks is getting complicated because there just aren't enough weeks in the year.

Gov. Paul L. Patterson, as was the custom of the governors before him, issues more than 60 statements a year proclaiming and designating special weeks and days. There being only 52 weeks a year, there's bound to be some overlapping.

The problem facing the Oregon citizen is that he often has to observe several special weeks at once.

For instance, last October, Cheese Week and Bible Week were observed at the same time.

During another week that same month, it was a four-day week. It was Emphysema Week, the Physically Handicapped, Letter Writing, Pharmacy, and Fire Prevention weeks, all at once.

Right now, you're observing Be Kind to Animals Week, and this Saturday you will celebrate Loyalty Day.

Next week comes a big payoff. It will be Mother's Day. Correct Posture, Hearing, and Mental Health weeks, providing another opportunity to get four weeks at a single price.

How do these weeks come about? Well, let's pretend that you are the manager of the Kumquat Growers Association of Oregon, and Kumquats aren't selling so well.

You write to the governor and ask him to proclaim Kumquat Week. You also send him a few lines, explaining how Kumquats are vital to the health of the state, and what a vital commodity Kumquats are to the state's economy.

The governor then issues a statement proclaiming Kumquat Week. It might not get into print, but you get a copy of it. You proudly show it to members of the Kumquat Producers Association, and they think you're right on the ball.

That's a slightly far-fetched idea about how weeks are born in Oregon. But it's exaggerated only because Oregon doesn't grow Kumquats. But there really is such a thing as a Kumquat. They taste like an orange and are awfully good, too.

On this subject of food, we have Oregon Products, Canned Salmon, Dairy Products, Cheese, and Pacific Coast Oyster weeks.

The break really goes to the eggs, though. The whole month of February is egg month in Oregon.

There also are quite a few days and weeks set aside for religious observances. These include World Day of Prayer, Sunday School Week, World Fellowship Week, Operation Prayer, and Religion in American Life Month.

Gov. Patterson also issues appeals for contributions to worthy causes. But he generally does this without naming special weeks.

Several of the special weeks and days deal with patriotism and its various phases. We have Marine Corps Reserve Week, Armed Forces Day, Loyalty Day, I Am An American Day, Day of Freedom, Americanism Week, Marine Corps Anniversary, and Bill of Rights Day.

Then we have special occasions for various organizations. These include Beauty Salon, Advertising Recognition, American Legion Legion Birthday, Campfire Girls, Union Label, Business Women's, and Optimist weeks.

There are special weeks calling attention to diseases and handicaps, such as cancer, blindness, deafness and mental disease.

Every father and mother gets into the act, too, with proclamations of Father's Day, Mother's Day, and Mother's Week. The mothers have a big advantage, though, getting a week and a day, while the fathers draw only a day.

Other weeks are Farm Safety, Jerusalem, American Education, Wildlife, Crime Prevention, Child

Alaska Vote Results Told

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) — Alaska Democrats' hopes for a 1954 general election comeback soared Thursday along with their mounting vote totals from Tuesday's primary election.

There was a strong swing of voters into the Democratic primary in contrast to the territory's election of a Republican Legislature two years ago—two weeks before the nation also swung Republican.

E. L. Bartlett, the Democratic delegate to Congress, increased his margin over his only opponent, territorial Auditor Neil Moore, to about a 7 to 1 ratio.

The combined vote for the two Democratic candidates continued at a 4 to 1 margin over the combined vote of the two Republican candidates.

Territorial Rep. Barbara Dimock of Anchorage clinched the Republican nomination to oppose Bartlett in the general election.

In two of the territory's four judicial divisions, which went strongly Republican for the Legislature two years ago, bigger votes were polled by two Democratic candidates, running unopposed for territorial Senate nominations, than in the three-way contests on the Republican side.

New Antarctic Expedition Eyed

WASHINGTON (AP) — A new United States expedition to the antarctic, the first in six years, was proposed Thursday to open new sources of mineral wealth and validate territorial claims of this country in the antarctic region.

A bill by Sen. Case (R-SD) and Rep. Tollefson (R-Wash.), prepared for introduction, would authorize an appropriation of \$200,000 for the expedition and loan of equipment by government agencies.

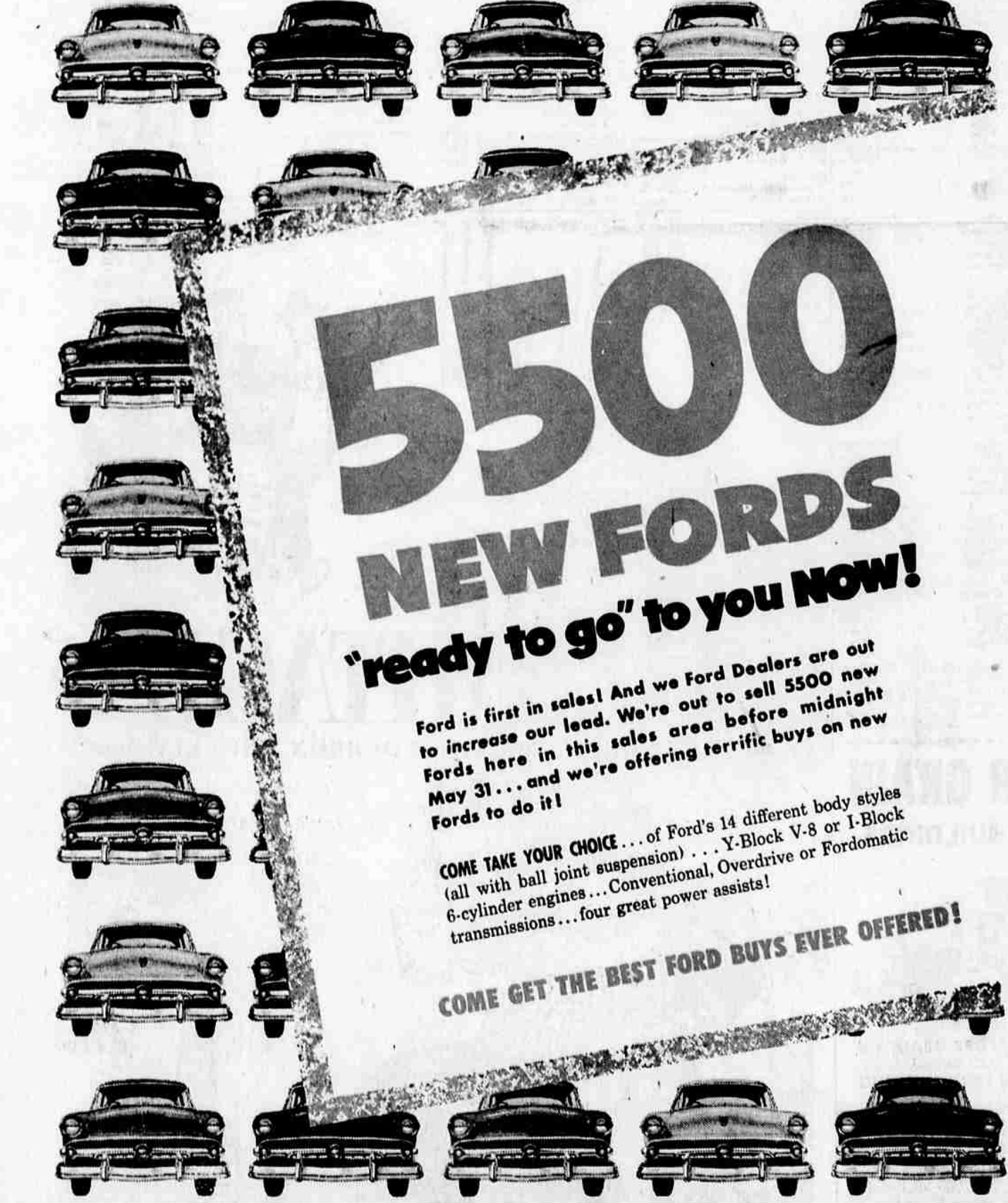
