The flow of United States traffic into old Mexico has increased to the point that vacationers like the Franklin Weavers with an exploratory bent seek the more remote villages which haven't yet become tourists meccas with attendant loss of native charm.

The women wear wool skirts with wide pleats held at the waist with brightly hued fringed sashes. They (the skirts) play a dual role; serving at night as blankets. Nearly all of the natives are barefooted.

When pursuing duck (sitting or flying) the old Mexican atlatl or throwing spear is used. Gleverly manipulated by the hunter it is thrown in such a way that it comes down on the target pinning it with the pronged end of the light-weight pole, which floats and is easily retrieved. The Weavers were fascinated with the ease and accuracy displayed.
