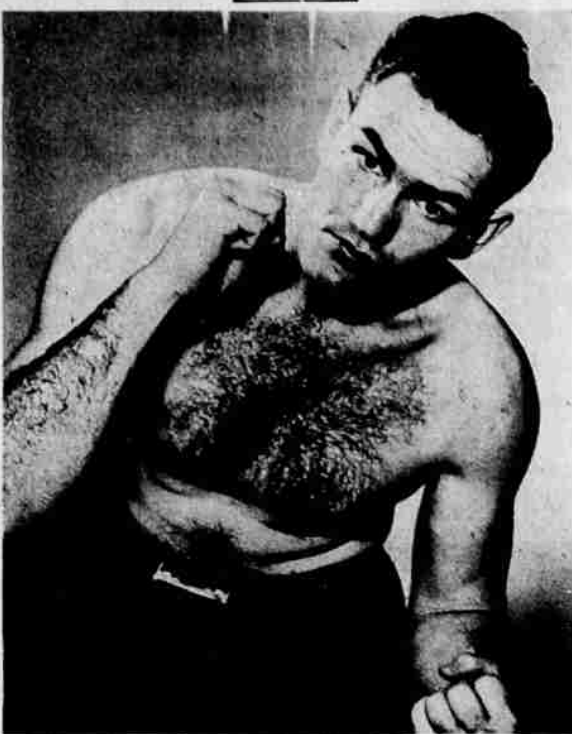


Walker Sustains Injury; Mathis Signed For Byrne



JARRIN' JIMMY BYRNE will be in the featured bout of the evening when he meets Big Bill Mathis in Friday night's boxing card. Byrne was slated to face Andy Walker, but Walker is sidelined with an injured hand, that was hurt in recent workouts in San Francisco.

Promoter Mack Lillard received a shot in the arm from Mother Nature last night, when he found Big Bill Mathis ready and willing to take Andy Walker's place in this Friday night's main event of the Armory boxing card.

Walker's manager telegraphed Lillard that the giant Negro had sustained a badly injured hand in Monday's workouts, and doctors advised him not to use it because there was a possible fracture involved.

It just so happened that Mathis, who has fought Byrne before, was the one that Walker injured his hand against. Mathis, who scales somewhere around the 230 mark, was sparring with Walker when the accident happened.

Byrne holds a knockout win over the big Californian in a Portland fight just recently, but Mathis says that it was a lucky punch that landed after the San Francisco Negro had built up a lead on points over Byrne.

Byrne also stated that it could have been a lucky punch but insists that he can do it again, so it boils down to a "I told you so" fight for the main event ten rounder this Friday night.

Besides landing a fighter like Mathis, Lillard pulled four aces out of the hat when he tentatively signed Al Moore, the ring clown who made such a hit with local boxing fans a while back, with The Beatty Bomber, Ralph Weiser.

Weiser and Moore fought it out to a draw in their last meeting, in the semi-windup to the Byrne-Roger Smith bout late in March. Armory fans will remember Moore from his unorthodox style of fighting, and Weiser will remember the McChord Air Force fighter because of the confusing style that Moore fought.

The Weiser-Moore battle is slated to go six rounds, and will be the semi-windup to the ten round headliner of Byrne-Mathis.

Portland, Seattle Both Lose In South

The Seattle Rainiers and Portland Beavers opened a new tour of the Pacific Coast League's California branch Tuesday night and what was planned as an invasion started out like a retreat.

Both the Northern teams lost their series-openers in the Southland.

The Rainiers, who dropped recent home stands to San Diego and Sacramento, squared off against Charley Dressen's Oakland Oaks, and were humbled 7-1.

Portland had its opener at Los Angeles in a last-gasp rally scored twice and beat the Beavers 4-3.

Catcher Al Evans of Los Angeles was the hero.

With two on base and two down in the ninth, Evans picked Red Adams' first pitch for a sizzling

double that just eluded the frantic dive of Portland leftfielder Fletcher Robble. The Angels, the weakest hitting team in years at Wrigley, not only six blows, Dixie Upright, poled a 390-foot homer for Los Angeles and Charley Grant and Dino Restelli clouted similar blows for the Ports.

Oakland scored all its seven runs in the fourth inning against Seattle. Pitcher Steve Nagy started by walking the bases full and before the inning was over three pitchers had seen service. Oakland's Gene Hermanski, who had hit safely in 14 consecutive games, was stopped. Don Ferrarese, promising southpaw, was the winning pitcher.

Roger Bowman, a good left hander who had won only one game this season against five losses, pitched Hollywood to a 3-3 decision over San Diego. The defeat for the Padres cost them first place in the standings, for Oakland, in beating Seattle, took over the top spot.

Al Cicotte hurled Sacramento to a 4-2 victory over San Francisco, allowing seven hits.

Cicotte also stepped up to the plate in the seventh inning with one out and one man on base and hit a home run that won the ball game.

Wildness by the Ashland pitchers, and clutch hitting gave the Klamath Falls Pelicans an 11-1 run-conference win over the Grizzlies on Wright Field yesterday afternoon.

The Pels started with two runs in the first, on two base balls, and a fielders choice, and then jumped on Ashland pitching in the second and third innings for six more runs.

In the third inning, Dave Leeling opened the Klamath ball with a soaring triple, but when he tried to stretch it into a home run, he was cut down on the plate. With one down Don Dexter blasted a long four bagger over the center-fielder's head, and the Pelicans proceeded to score three more times in the frame.
