Millionaire Plans Sex Operation

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — John Cabell (Bunny) Breckinridge, 50-year-old San Francisco millionaire, said Tuesday he is going to Denmark in August to be transformed into Catherine Cabell.

Breckinridge, who told interviewers he has "the soul of a woman," said he believed an operation would result in his complete transformation from man to woman.

Breckinridge said he had been thinking about the operation for a long time and in the past few months had made arrangements with a British surgeon to change him from man to woman. He declined to name the surgeon.

"After word got out that I was going to do this two gentlemen

have offered me their hand and heart and fortune," Breckinridge said. "I declined of course."

"A further in New York offered me a \$20,000 milk coat which I'll take, of course."

The long-haired millionaire, whose fingernails glisten like mother-of-pearl, said that upon his return he is going to marry "a young man from up north." The young man is married and has four children, "whom I adore," Breckinridge said, but a divorce will solve all that.

Dickenson Sentenced To 10 Years

WASHINGTON (AP) — Col. Edward S. Dickenson faced 10 years in prison today after his conviction on collaborating with the enemy charges in a case that may set a precedent for Army handling of other Americans under suspicion for their conduct while war prisoners in Korea.

An eight-man Army court-martial yesterday returned a guilty verdict on charges that Dickenson, a 23-year-old farm boy from Cracker Neck, Va., dealt unlawfully with his Red Chinese captors and informed the Reds about the escape plans of a buddy, former Pic. Edward M. Gaither of Philadelphia.

The court reached its decision after more than 10 hours of deliberation, then retired and nearly an hour later brought in a sentence of 10 years in prison at hard labor and a dishonorable discharge. Dickenson could have drawn life imprisonment.

The court's verdict and sentence are headed for study by an Army board of review. Dickenson's lawyer, Guy Emery, said he would appeal, if that board does not reverse the court-martial action.

The Air Force cleared 69 officers and airmen of all taint, but it held that 14 others must show cause why they should be allowed to remain in uniform.
