Greece Rocked By New Quake

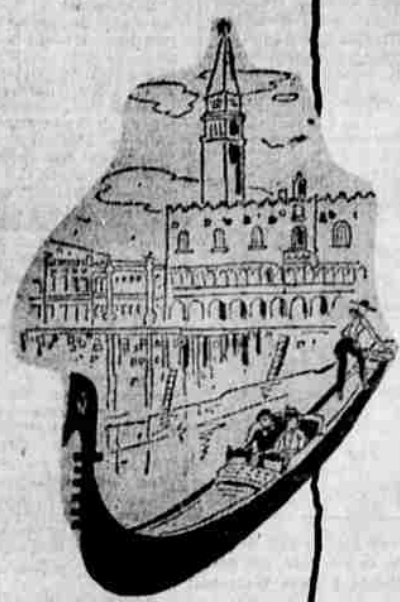
