Woman Accused Of Moving Body

PORTLAND (AP)—Mrs. Sherri Fong, 23, was accused Wednesday of transporting the body of a dead high school girl without the permission of the coroner.

The body was that of Diane Agnes Hank, 16, who disappeared after spending a night early in January at the home of Wey Him Fong and his Caucasian wife. The girl's body was found beside a road near Washougal, Wash., on Feb. 26.

Detective Capt. William D. Browne signed the complaint against Mrs. Fong. He said he filed the charge in order to keep her in custody for further questioning on the girl's death. He said one of the possibilities being explored is that the girl committed suicide.

An autopsy did not disclose the cause of death.

In an earlier period of questioning Mrs. Fong said she knew nothing of the death. She said the girl spent the night at her home, but was in good health in the morning and left for school. Mrs. Fong disappeared after that.
