Pigg Hearing To Continue

A preliminary hearing of the second degree murder charge against Arthur P. Pigg, 73-year-old night club photographer, will continue Monday at 9 a.m. in District Judge D. E. Van Vactor's court.

Pigg is accused of the gun slaying of Roy Durham, 48, at the climax of a quarrel over women. Durham was shot twice in front of Pigg's home early on the morning of April 25.

Deputy District Attorney Robert Kerr asked for a recess in the hearing Friday afternoon. He explained that Dr. George H. Adler, county coroner and one of his key witnesses was out of the city.

The hearing which has taken on the aspect of a trial with lengthy testimony revealed that Pigg was involved with three women, Mrs. Eulah Durham, ex-wife of the homicide victim, testified Durham was enraged because Pigg had been taking whisky to two women known as "Thelma" and "Betty."

Police say Pigg and Durham quarreled over the affections of Mrs. Durham.

It is expected when the prosecution rests its case, Defense Attorney J. C. O'Neill will call several witnesses.
