Jimmy Durante Drops Out Of Comedy Hour TV Show

HOLLYWOOD — Last night the Great Schnozola did his swan song for the Comedy Hour, but he's not going with TV.
 Jimmy Durante told me the reason he won't be back on the Sunday night extravaganza:
 "They're changing the whole setup on the show. The advertising agency is taking over most of the shows (20 for next season). NBC has the rest and they wanted me to do only three or four next year. I don't want to do that. I think a comedian shouldn't be on any less than every four weeks."
 "It's okay for guys like Martin and Lewis, because they're doing pictures too. But I don't want to do only three or four a season."
 Last night's show marked the end of Durante's association with the hour-long extravaganza. For three years, he was one of the kings of the All-Star Revue. When that series hit the rocks, he was switched over to the Comedy Hour, for which he has done eight shows this season.
 "What about next year?"
 "I don't know what I'll do," said the Schnoz. "I might do a half-hour show every other week. This hour show routine is kinda rugged. All that memorizing to get Most of the other stars read their lines off cards and prompts. I can't do that. I can't see that far without my glasses."
 Jimmy, who has never been noted for a fabulous memory, faces the added burden of being on-camera for most of the show. And he always has special songs which

require lots of memorizing.
 He emphasized that he wouldn't do a show every week for all the money the network could offer him. He'd like to alternate weeks with another show.
 Jimmy is under long-term contract to NBC, so he's obliged to stay in TV, but he wants to anyway.
 "I think it's wonderful," he said. "It's a lot of work puttin' on an hour show, but after it's all over with, it don't seem so bad. And the reaction from the fans! It's wonderful. I'll never forget the letters I got from the first show I did. Great letters, and they didn't even ask for an autographed picture."
 "I also got a great reaction from the last show I did — the one with Liberace. The people were wild about it."

Huge Estate In Dispute

DETROIT — The \$6-million-dollar estate of auto pioneer Horace E. Dodge, and how it is managed, will be argued in Detroit Probate Court today.
 Mrs. Christine Cromwell Asserson, 30, of West Dodge grand-daughter, is asking the removal of her grandmother, Mrs. Ann Dodge, 81, and the Detroit Trust Co. as trustees.
 Mrs. Asserson's suit, filed earlier, said the estate was managed too conservatively. She reportedly will fall heir to 14 million dollars of the estate on her grandmother's death.
 Seldon B. Daume, president of the trust company, said yesterday the company was proud of its record and had kept the estate at its \$6-million-dollar level even during the depression.
 Mrs. Asserson, married four times, said she has borrowed on some three million dollars of her expected inheritance. Her suit accuses management of the estate of being so conservative that she had to accept rates as low as 30 cents on the dollar for her loans.
 Living in the Virgin Islands, Mrs. Asserson operates a botanical garden, an airport bar and a night club there.

Oldest War Vet Takes To Air

TULSA, Okla. — Loby Torres, 109-year-old veteran of the Spanish-American War from Enid, Okla., took off yesterday on his first airplane ride with a comment about longevity.
 He said he was afraid young men nowadays are going to have a tougher time living to be over 100. They're getting married young, he observed, and don't last as long. Torres has outlived three wives.
 His first flight was from Tulsa to San Francisco.
