Plucky Ten-Year-Old OK After Upset In Old Mis

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP)—Ten-year-old Darlene Roaten, who doesn't swim, supported herself with a small piece of cork for more than three hours yesterday while the current swept her 10 miles down the Mississippi River.

Her father, J. S. Roaten, meanwhile, swam more than two hours to rescue his wife and their son Bobby, 8, after they and Darlene had stepped off an underwater sandbar into the swift Mississippi current.

Roaten threw them pieces of old life jackets and leaped from their

17-foot motorboat and swam to the rescue of his family. He left another son, Michael, 4, in the boat with the motor idling.

The boat began drifting and Roaten swam after it for more than two hours before he regained it. Then he used the boat to pick up his wife and Bobby but Darlene had drifted out of sight.

She was picked up just before dark by the towboat Zephyr out of St. Louis. A crewman saw her bobbing along in the current. A witness said the piece of cork supporting her was about half the size of a cigar box.

The family was on a pleasure cruise in a 17-foot inboard motorboat. The craft struck a sandbar near an island. All except Michael got out to push the boat off the bar, the water was only six inches deep where the boat ran aground.

"All of a sudden there was no sand, and we were in the water," said Mrs. Roaten after her rescue. "All three of us went different ways."

Tractors Use Hurts Ground

TULELAKE—A tractor moving over ground only once shortly after irrigation can reduce the water infiltration by a third, according to University of California irrigation technologists, reports Ken Baggett, farm adviser.

Lloyd D. Doneen, professor of irrigation on the Davis campus, in studying moisture penetration on soils at various lengths of time after irrigation, found that sandy soils are damaged by tractors even when dry.

One pass of a tractor a few days after irrigation can cut down water penetration from one and one half inch per minute to half an inch, he said.

Once a soil is compacted, said Doneen, it is difficult to correct the condition. The best method is to wait until the soil is very dry and chisel or subsoil the compacted area.

Actor, Director Combine To Form Successful Team

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The most successful team in the movies? You might nominate Martin and Lewis or Abbott and Costello.

My candidates are Stewart and Mann.

The actor is James Stewart, lanky ex-colonel and Oscar winner ("Philadelphia Story"—1940) from Indiana, Pa. He'll be 45 May 20.

The Mann behind the camera is Anthony, also 46, former actor, stage director and film talent scout from San Diego. He has directed Stewart into a tidy fortune.

All of their films together have been big money makers. The unique part of their arrangement is that Stewart received half of the profits from most of their movies, the ones made at Universal-International. (Mann also shares in the proceeds of some of them).

This can be a fancy figure. Their current "Glenn Miller Story," for example, it shapes up as U-I's biggest grosser. Reports have indicated that Stewart's take alone will amount to two million dollars or more.

I visited them on the set of their seventh film, "Strategic Air Command," to learn their secrets of success. Both are modest, business-like fellows who disclaim any magic formula.

Mann, a slouched, bald, friendly man, said they seek real locations for the authentic touch in their

films. They made "Winchester '73" in Arizona, "Bend of the River" in Oregon, "The Naked Spur" in Colorado, "Thunder Bay on the Gulf Coast of Louisiana, "Glenn Miller" in Denver, Colo., "The Far Country" in Jasper National Park, Canada, and "Strategic Air Command" at Tampa, St. Petersburg and Fort Worth.

Now working at Paramount, the Stewart-Mann combine next moves to independent producer William Goetz for "The Man from Laramie." After that, they hope to go far afield for a movie, perhaps to Europe.
