Teen-Age Runaway Makes Himself At Home In Tiny Room Off New York Subway

NEW YORK (AP)—A teen-age runaway, who for 12 days kept house in an unused subway cable-epilepsy room, has been evicted from his hideout 20 feet below a busy street intersection in Brooklyn.

The youngster, Robert C. Lindahl, 15, had equipped his neat bachelor quarters with an old auto seat for a bed, a rickety wire chair and other comforts salvaged from a dump. A picture of a basket of flowers adorned the wall.

The boy told police he had discovered the underground room while playing with friends, and decided to move there in order to escape school and his father's rule about being home by 8:30 at night.

Police discovered Robert asleep in his secret lodgings yesterday after a friend who had been entertained there let the boy's family know where he was.

It had been a lot of fun, Robert said, "but I won't do it again. The

police said they'll put me in a real hole—with bars—next time."

The noise of traffic clanking across a manhole cover overhead didn't disturb him after the first night, he reported.

During the day Robert would push aside a sliding steel door and slip out of the subway tunnel where it emerged into an open cut near the Brooklyn Botanic Garden.

Then he would head for Manhattan, where he collected as much as \$3 a day in handouts and tips for running errands. However, his resources had dwindled to 2 cents by the time he was sent home.

Empty bottles and cans in his hideout showed his meals there consisted of root beer and beans. He had religious candles for light and a can of alcohol for cooking.

Back home where he lives with his grandmother, three sisters and his father, a widower cab driver—Robert was given a bath and a hearty meal. His father, grinning over the escapade, packed the shaggy-haired boy off to a barber shop.

Schwable To Be Assigned

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Marine Corps Tuesday assigned Col. Frank H. Schwable, the principal in the corps' recent inquiry into his signing of a false germ warfare confession while he was a prisoner of war in Korea, to take a flight refresher course.

The decision of the inquiry court was not to file charges against the flier.

Upon completion of the course at the Cherry Point, N.C., Marine Base, Schwable will be assigned to duty in Washington as Marine representative in the Navy flight safety program.

Schwable was a combat pilot in World War II and was chief of staff of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing in Korea when he was shot down on an observation flight.

The court of inquiry held that the treatment he received at the hands of his Communist captors left him no alternative but to comply with their demands to sign the germ warfare confession which he repudiated as soon as he was freed.

In forwarding the findings of the court to the Defense Department, the corps commandant and the Navy secretary said Schwable's future military usefulness had been limited by his action while a prisoner.

Moving Sidewalk May Be Answer To Commuter Idea

AKRON, Ohio (AP)—Conveyor belts, which have been lugging coal and ore and the like for years, are going to tackle commuters two weeks from today.

New Jersey citizens who use the Erie Railroad and then the tubes under the Hudson River to get to work in Manhattan will be taking their first rides on a moving sidewalk in Jersey City.

The belt could care for almost 11,000 foot-sore commuters an

hour. The greater part of it covers a 10 per cent grade. It's supposed to ease pedestrian traffic jams as well as weary muscles.

Workers in this city made the 460-foot continuous belt. And workers in Aurora, Ill., turned out the 36 tons of equipment on which the belt rides.

The Jersey City installation is called the world's first commercial passenger conveyor belt. Its builders hope it will be the first of many.

Some of the plans are pretty million dollars, and New York is elaborate, like the proposal to replace the trains in the shuttle between Times Square and Grand Central Station with little cabs to carry New York's hordes along on a rubber belt.

New York transit authorities like the idea of transporting up to 16,000 persons per hour each way through the busy shuttle, without any pile-ups while waiting for trains. But the conveyor would cost about four

times as much as the existing system. But there, too, cost of installing the system are giving city fathers pause.
