

### Wet Weather Over South

 More rain fell in the already wet parts of the South Thursday but skies cleared in nearly all other sections of the country and a little warmer weather appeared on the way.

The showery belt extended from portions of Mississippi, Tennessee and Southern Kentucky southeastward across most of Florida. Although there was only a trace of rain in Miami during the night the total for the last 24 hours was

more than 2 1/2 inches. The heaviest falls were due to a storm moving eastward along the immediate Gulf Coast.

The only other wet spots were along the eastern slopes of the Rockies and in Western North Dakota. There was some fog and clouds along the Pacific Coast but other sections of the country reported fair to partly cloudy skies.

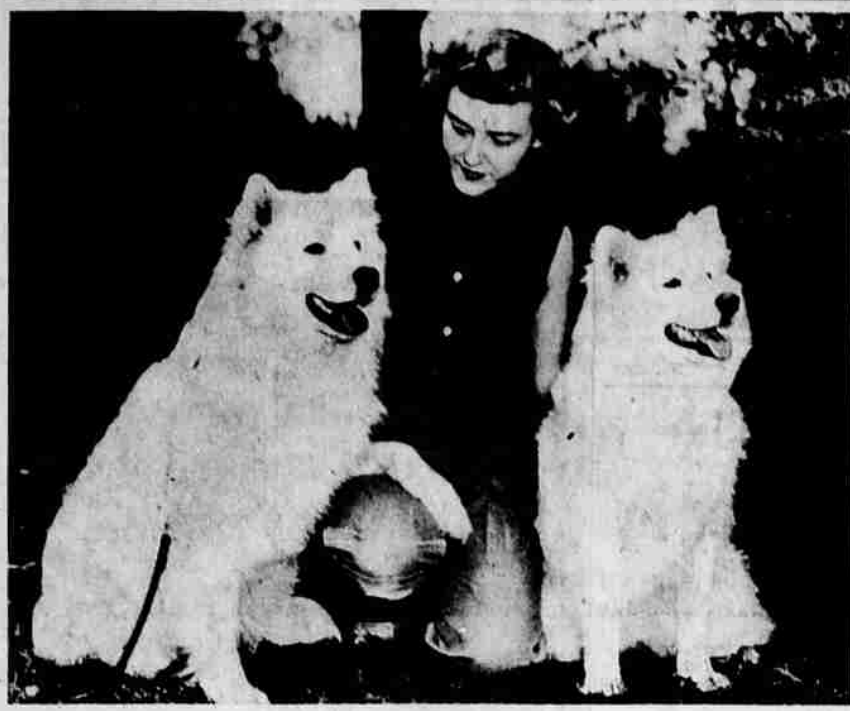

### Oregon Forest Damage Told

Severe damage to over 80,000 acres of valuable timber in Southern Jackson and Josephine counties has occurred, apparently due to unusual weather conditions during February, according to a report by foresters from the Medford district office of the Bureau of Land Management. Various proportions of the needles on both large and small Douglas fir and white fir trees in the area have been killed giving the entire forested area affected a reddish-brown hue.

The damage is concentrated mostly above 4500 feet in the Siskiyou Mountains near the California line from Oregon Caves to Mt. Ashland. The upper portions of trees located on south facing slopes near ridge tops are affected the most. Nearly all the timberland in the area is under the jurisdiction of the Federal Government, either O & C lands, converted lands, or national forest lands. Entomologists from the State Forestry Dept. and U. S. Forest Service flew over the area Thursday and agreed that the weather is probably responsible.

Winter damage of this kind to stands of mature timber is unusual in Southern Oregon. It is caused by warm, dry weather during a time when the ground is frozen so that the sap cannot flow in the trees. The warm dry air desiccates the needles to such an extent that they die. If a large

portion of an evergreen tree is defoliated the tree itself probably will die since it cannot regenerate its needles as readily as a deciduous tree can replace its leaves.

Foresters and entomologists plan to watch the area closely this summer to observe how the affected trees recuperate and learn whether the various insect enemies of the forest which are always present succeed in building up to epidemic number in the weakened trees.
