BROWN BUTTER SAUCE For a brown butter sauce to serve on broccoli, brown 1-3 cup butter until quite dark. To it add 2 tablespoons lemon juice or vinegar. Pass in a small heated pitcher for a glorified touch.

COFFEE GLACES Have six egg whites at room temperature and beat until frothy. Sprinkle with 1/2 teaspoon each of salt and cream of tartar and beat until soft peaks are formed. Gradually beat in 1 1/2 cups sifted sugar combined with 1 teaspoon instant coffee powder, adding 1/4 teaspoon almond extract with last of sugar. Continue beating until sugar is dissolved and meringue stands in peaks. On a brown-paper covered cookie sheet drop heaping tablespoons of meringue, forming into shells and hollowing out center with back of a teaspoon. Bake

70 minutes at 250 degrees. Cool, with ice cream and sliced fresh fruit. Remove from paper. Serve filled fruit. Makes 12.
