**Premier Laniel Of France Faces Crucial Vote Today**

PARIS (AP) — Premier Joseph Laniel sought a vote of confidence today from a balky National Assembly. The outcome will decide the fate of his shaky government and possibly that of the Geneva conference as well. If 314 negative votes are cast, Laniel will have to resign. His coalition is rounding out its 11th month in office, an unusually long term in France. Political experts gave him only a slim chance of surviving today's vote. The issue was the Premier's demand that debate on Indochina be

postponed until after the Geneva conference. He won a 311-262 confidence vote on the same question last Thursday, but that was before the fall of Dien Bien Phu aroused nationwide bitterness. In Laniel's favor, however, French Foreign Minister Georges Bidault is in the midst of negotiations at Geneva for much-desired peace in Indochina. To throw out the government now would mean throwing out Bidault as well. While much of the resentment in the Assembly was directed against the foreign minister, many deputies were hesitant about leaving France voiceless at Geneva because of a Cabinet crisis. The general desire to have France fully represented at international conferences has done much to keep Laniel in office. He won previous confidence votes because of then-pending negotiations, first at Bermuda and later in Berlin. The deputies have been generally bitter over Laniel's refusal to debate the Indochina situation at this time. Many also feared that if they voted confidence in him, their people back home might interpret it as approval of the Dien Bien Phu situation. On the other hand a government crisis could lead to dissolution of

the Assembly and new elections, which few deputies would relish. Laniel argued that "an unprepared debate now" on Indochina would lessen the government's authority and would "suspend the work of the Geneva conference."
