SPOKANE, Idaho — Bing Crosby, who recently sold his summer home at nearby Hayden Lake, Idaho for an estimated \$25,000, says he's going to build another "little place" there for something around \$25,000.

"Hope it doesn't run any higher than that," the crooner said after a round of golf at the Spokane Country Club.

John D. Bradley, new executive vice president of the Bunker Hill & Sullivan Mining and Concentrating Co., bought his old house. Bing's new place, with construction to start next month, will be across the lake.

Crosby, winding up a four-day trip to Hayden and Spokane, said he and three of his four sons will probably vacation in Hawaii this summer, while son Gary takes over his radio show.

"Gary likes show business and loves to sing," he said. "He's gotta get his feet wet in show business sometime so I might as well let him go."

Columbia Flood Said Not Likely

PORTLAND, Ore. — River Forecaster Elmer Fisher said Thursday that British Columbia flood conditions appear to be a local situation and are not likely to have any serious effect on the Columbia River system.

"There has been little precipitation in the Columbia Basin and temperatures still are too low to cause heavy snow melt," he said. "Nearly all rivers in the Columbia system were falling this morning."

Atomic War Would Double Casualties

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS, Allied Powers in Europe (AP) — Atomic weapons are expected to double the number of casualties suffered by American armed forces if war should come, the chairman of the 13-nation Allied Medical Conference says.

"Instead of thinking in terms of 6 to 8 per cent of our forces as casualties, we are counting on having 12 to 16 per cent of our men injured," Brig. Gen. William J. Kennard, U. S. Air Force, told reporters after the three-day medical discussion closed yesterday.

Motorists Amazed At Auto Fight

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Dumb-founded motorists watched the driver of a black car and a taxi joust with might and main on Lake Shore Drive yesterday.

They rammed their vehicles together head-on, wheeled, and banged together again.

A heavy truck broke up the action briefly when it drove through.

Finally the black car and the cab pulled backward a space and raced toward one another at top speed. The cab swerved at the last instant and fled.

Police are trying to find out what the duel was about.

Intrepid Swimmer Fined by Court

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — A 68-year-old man goes on trial in City Police Court here June 2 because he likes to swim by himself half a mile from shore.
