Famed Boat Racer Escapes When Unusual Ship Sinks

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—The "unsinkable" twin-hulled yacht *Venturi* lay in her watery grave off Great Isaac Light in the Bahamas today but Gar Wood, 73-year-old speed-boat racer and builder, and eight others were safe.
 The 188-foot *Venturi* broke up in heavy seas while returning to Miami from a round trip to Nassau yesterday. Wood, his secretary, his Negro housekeeper and six crew members were rescued.
 Wood, who designed the 130-ton craft for use by the Army Air Force in 1944 and reacquired it from the government five years later; his secretary Jean Berry, 24; and the housekeeper, Jodie Rodriguez, were brought to Miami last night. A Coast Guard helicopter snatched them from a lifeboat wallowing in heavy seas about 85 miles east of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.
 The others — Capt. C. A. MacCallum, R. B. Stayga, C. J. Berger, J. S. Meister, Harry Polson and M. Vandenberg, all of Miami — were picked up from small boats by the fishing craft, *Jerry Mar*, and taken to Great Isaac Light, near the scene of the accident. Plans were to bring them to Miami today by a Coast Guard patrol boat.
 "The *Venturi* was going 22 to 23 knots in deep water when we ran into a bad storm," Wood said. "The waves were high, 10 feet or more, and we came into it so suddenly we didn't have time to slow down."

Navarre Plan For Defense Of Indochina Written Off

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Navarre plan, upon which the American and French governments once based their hopes for winning the Indochina war, now has been quietly written off by authorities here.
 French officials also indicate they feel the plan has little pertinence since Dien Bien Phu. That French Union fortress fell after the Communist-led Vietnam came out in the open to fight.
 One of the Navarre plan's main assumptions had been that the Vietnam would continue guerrilla tactics.
 Developed about a year ago by Gen. Henri Navarre, French commander in Indochina, the plan called for training of scores of new native battalions. Use of these battalions for police duties would free French, North African and Foreign Legion troops for combat duty.
 It was hoped this would achieve control over the Reds within about two years.
 By promising an eventual end to the Indochina war, the plan formed a basis for obtaining additional American help in military equipment to finish the job.
 The Vietnam demonstrators at Dien Bien Phu that they have the training, equipment and will to fight standard military operations on a relatively large scale.
 U.S. officials familiar with the Indochina fighting say the Chin Communist military supplies and training — reinforced by Soviet ideas, technical assistance and equipment — changed the nature of the fight. In addition they are concerned over certain reported weaknesses on French and native side.
 As a result, various high officials here are now convinced that the choice before President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles comes down to this:
 "United States intervention in the fighting could rebalance the Indochina forces and give new hope for anti-Communist success."
