

Pelicans Place Four In State Track Meet

Klamath Falls will be represented by four Pelican trackmen in the state high school track and field meet this weekend at Corvallis, while Medford places 14, Grant Pass 6, Ashland 3, and Illinois Valley placed one as did Crater.

Jim Bevans won the 100 yard dash to be the only Pel to win an event in the Saturday District 3-A track and field meet. His time was 16.2.

The Pelicans who will journey to the state meet are Jim Dougherty, who placed second in the high hurdles, and the relay team of Bevans, Dougherty, Don Mills and Dave Pepple.

Two district records were broken in the meet as Jack Brophy threw the discus 156 feet seven inches to break Jerry Langer's old mark of 152 feet four and one half inches.

The other record breaking feat was turned in by Lewis Breazal and Benson Foley both of Medford who tied for first in the pole vault with a jump of 12 feet 2 inches. Dale Neidermeyer, also of Medford held the old mark of 12 feet one half inch.

Other Klamath entries to place were Dougherty, third in the broad jump, Cedar Colley sixth in the discus, Jim King, sixth in the javelin, Dougherty second in the shot put.

Lawyer fifth in the shot, Dougherty third in the high hurdles, Wells third in the mile, Tom Ferrell fifth in the 440 yard dash and Guy Munsell, who tied for fourth in the high jump.

The scores for the meet were Grants Pass 23-23, Medford 79-13, Klamath 51-16, Ashland 48, Crater 22-23, Illinois Valley 18, Eagle Point 11-16, and Phoenix 5.

The four Pelicans and Coaches Len Surles and Bob Hendershot will leave for Corvallis Friday for the two day meet on the Oregon State College campus.

A teammate was on first when The Man rapped a grounder between the first and second basemen. Gil Hodges, Brooklyn first sacker, scooped it up and started to throw for the forcetout at second. He saw he would be late, so whirled for a toss to first, but found that his pitcher hadn't reached the base in time. So both runners were safe.

It was scored as a fielder's choice on the ground that Hodges had "made an attempt to retire a preceding runner," even though he didn't actually throw the ball. Musial, who has his sights set on reaching 3,000 hits before he's through, was torn with anguish. Perhaps the rule is wrong, but it doesn't specify that a throw must be made.
