AMONG THE ROSES

As the hybrid tea rose is usually grown for the beauty of its blooms, rather than the ornamental effect of its bush many gardeners plant them in the garden in a row. At least for me they are easier to care for that way. Anyway it seems logical as the bushes don't seem to get large enough in this country to merit an ornamental planting of them. Planting them in a border with other plants seems to make them lose some of their glamour. I did this at first then moved them all to a corner of the garden where the flowers stand out more.

In milder climates they are used more ornamentally by putting them in narrow beds, not more than two rows deep and surrounding them with lawn. They are lovely this way when there are a number of each variety in each bed, so that their habits of growth are the same. I guess it would work here too, if one were really ambitious, but it always seemed to me that with the frost nips they get in the spring, they stay kind of "ratty" looking until the weather settles down.

By the way, in the last little piece about the roses, I mentioned that these are not tea roses, then a sentence was left out and it should have said that they are developments of the tea and different species of wild roses, and are crossed and re-crossed from these beginnings.

The next most important of the modern roses, are the ones we know as the floribunda. We are told this is not official as there

has always been a species name (Rosa floribunda) and also a hybrid polyantha class, but the name appeared about 1935, and is used commonly.

Again we have the cross to develop, an everblooming type with flowers that resemble the hybrid tea but which grows several to a stem. It is really a hybrid polyantha and a cross of the tea rose and the polyantha or as a lot call them the baby rose. While the polyantha has quite a cluster of smaller flowers, mostly single and quite hardy. The cross with the tea rose makes the floribunda have a more distinct bloom, lots of them just like the tea rose, and while there are not quite so many flowers as the polyantha, they are larger with single, semi-double and double florets. Nearly all the colors that one finds in the hybrid tea, are found in these roses.

These can be used most any way a gardener desires. Having much more bloom they can be used in a perennial border, in front of evergreens and for masses of color or mixtures almost anywhere. They seem quite a bit harder here than the more delicate big sister. Of course like the hybrid tea there are those that "take it" a little better than the others. At first I got "a bush of this and a bush of that" and am finding out through experience the ones that give the most satisfaction. I am increasing these plantings for more decorative effects. Of course one must learn the names to distinguish the forms and colors. However that comes naturally if you get interested enough.

"Masquerade" is fascinating with its new little yellow buds that open yellow, and gradually turn a rosy red until the bush is covered with red and yellow posies in all stages of change. It has good growth habits and keeps its color. "Dagmar Spahn" is very good; white single, about four inches across with a little tuft in the center. "Donald Prior" is a rich velvety red single. "Betty Prior" is a single pink like a wild rose. "Kirsten Poulsen" is a bright cherry pink single. Then so many doubles, like "Fashion," the salmon color that really looks like a tea rose. There are so many kinds and colors that there is hardly any limit to what effects one could accomplish with them.
