Chiloquin To Vote On City Funds

Chiloquin voters will cast their ballots on a special city election in conjunction with Friday's primary on two measures in addition to state and county measures.

Proposition 51 calls for a transfer from the surplus funds in the Chiloquin beer store fund to the sewer disposal plant fund of that city in the sum of \$6000. The funds to be used to complete the building of an adequate sewerage disposal plant to comply with state law.

Proposition 52 calls for transfer of funds from the beer store surplus to the municipal water fund in the amount of \$10,000 to be used in the construction of additional storage facilities.

Neither of the propositions will increase taxes as the funds are already on hand. This method of completing the jobs is used to avoid any bonded indebtedness to the city.
