

# Truck Route Forum Held Over KFLW

The Herald and News switchboard was kept busy last night as interested voters cast in questions pertaining to the proposed truck route bond issue. A panel of four local businessmen aided by two technical experts was on hand to answer.

Biggest question in the minds of city dwellers appeared to be that of whether the one way couplet on Main and Klamath, the overpass on South Sixth and the Westside bypass would be built by the state if the voters plan were junked by the voters.

It was made plain by all concerned that these projects are already in the planning stage and will be carried out over the next two and a half years.

Second biggest issue was that of costs, many feeling that any additional taxation is uncalled for. Don Sloan and Lyle Kellstrom, speaking for those opposed to the proposal, stated that Klamath's tax base is already driving business in Medford, that Eugene has more industry because of a lower base and that, in their opinion, any further tax load would in effect ruin Klamath's chances for expansion.

Sloan stated that "Klamath's taxes are murderously high. Industry doesn't need a truck route and, while I would be the last one in the world to buck a truck route if it is needed, we should wait at least ten years and see which way Klamath goes."

Charles Mack, acting as technical adviser for the panel, stated that Klamath Falls has one of the lowest bonded indebtedness figures in the state, most of our debt being tied up in the new municipal swimming pool slated to open soon.

Another technical adviser, E. A. "Taxi" Thomas, city engineer, stated flatly in answer to a query that the state does not and will not build or maintain truck routes through cities. They establish the highway route and let it go at that.

Greer Drew and Harry Boivin, speaking in favor of the proposal made it quite plain that in their belief Klamath Falls will become more and more of a truck center, that truck shipments to small industry will increase in the area and that we may well be a big truck servicing center on Highway 97, already carrying the bulk of the north-south truck traffic.

It was pointed out by Drew that if no truck route is maintained by the city, then through trucks will roll down Main Street if southbound and up Klamath on the way north. This would lead, he said to unbearable congestion of our downtown shopping area, tend to lower property values and delay business traffic.

The proposed truck route would be controlled by lights and would carry trucks into the industrial area rather than into the downtown

# Nationalists, Reds Clash

TAIPEH, Formosa (AP) — Nationalist China's air force Wednesday said eight of its fighters presumably propeller type) clashed for 10 minutes with eight Communist MIG jets off Chekiang Province. The communique made no mention of damage, but a press officer said he believed several were hit. He refused to comment on a rumor that one MIG was destroyed. All Nationalist pilots returned safely, the air force said, as they have after three previous air battles within the past week. All have taken place in the same general area — off Chekiang Province about 150 miles south of Shanghai. Two MIGs were listed as damaged in earlier battles. The Air Force said pilots confirmed the sinking of an 800-ton Communist warship hit by bombs off Chekiang Tuesday.
