

Pacific Flyway Meet Planned

At a meeting held in Las Vegas, Nevada, last week and attended by fish and game representatives from seven western states, it was decided to make final recommendations for the Pacific Flyway at a meeting to be held in Klamath Falls sometime in July.

William J. Silva, president of the California fish and game commission stated that problems of cooperation between California, Oregon and Washington will be discussed here at the July meeting.

"Each state has different problems and during the past some have opposed what has been thought necessary in California," Silva said.

"We have decided to take all these problems to a meeting in Klamath Falls and iron out the kinks, before myself and president of the Oregon Commission, Phil Schneider, leave for Washington in August to ask the federal government what is desired this year in Pacific Flyway regulations," Silva stated.

Washington and Oregon "seem to be seeking" a double possession limit similar to one which California had in the past, he said.

The credit, which could be used for maintenance and support of aged or incapacitated Indians and for the health and education needs of children, would come from tribal resources.
