

Four Pelicans Entered In State Track Meet

Four Klamath Union High School trackmen and Coach Len Surles will journey to Corvallis tonight, for the state high school track and field meet, that will be held tomorrow and Saturday.

The four who qualified in the district meet last week at Medford, were Jim Bevans, Jim Dougherty, Don Mills and Dave Pepple.

Bevans will be entered in the 100 yard dash, and the relay. Dougherty will throw the shot put and also work on the relay team, while Mills and Pepple will comprise the other half of the 880 yard relay team that took second in the district meet.

In past meet results, Bevans stands very near the top of the list of high school sprinters in the century dash, with his best time of the season being turned in at 9.9 seconds.

Dougherty, who best throw of the shot is 50 feet 5 inches, also stands high in state prep circles with his distant heave.

During the past week, Surles has been keeping Bevans out of action because of a pulled muscle in the star Pelican's leg. The head coach expects Bevans to be ready for the two day meet.

According to comparable figures, the district number one and two relay teams, Medford and Klamath, should be among those who qualify for the finals, that will be held on Saturday.

Medford, the state's powerhouse in track, will probably go into the meet a strong favorite, along with Grants Pass and Eugene.

The Willamette Valley will be represented by three strong contenders, who could push Medford, in Salem, Milwaukie and Grant of Portland.

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Hardtops Schedule Changes

Gem Speedway will get its second taste of hardtop racing this season when the jairopies take the track this Sunday afternoon, with two major changes being put into effect.

The first change was made, when it was learned that two of the officials that were hired for the season will be unable to make the further Sunday shows this year.

Track Manager Sam Neslin announced earlier this week, that the team of officials that worked last year's races, will be brought back for the remaining program.

Another addition to this week's program will be the use of a new chemical in the water that is used on the track, to keep down the dust. This chemical is being obtained from Southern California and has been used with results on California tracks.

In last week's racing program, a dispute over the semi-main event's number two place arose when Al Rossi was spun out on the north turn, and when the race was restarted Rossi was down three laps, but the officials decline to count them, being that the yellow flag was down part of the time.

Neslin received a letter from Rossi this week, and the Mt. Shasta driver asked that he be moved to last spot, and move the other finishers up one spot. In his letter he stated, "Due to the good sportsmanship that has been shown in Klamath Falls, I wish to withdraw my second position and move the other drivers up one place."

After a majority of the local drivers that were involved in the race had read the letter, they all voted that the race was over, and Rossi should be given the second place money despite the errors that were made in the opening program.

The bugs and mixups that occurred last Sunday as well as other opening programs will probably be worked out by this week's show, with the drivers getting a new outlook on the remodeled track, the races should be more exciting this weekend.
