House Funds Recommended

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bigger al-
lowances for stationery, long-dis-
tance calls, home office upkeep,
postage and hired help for House
members were recommended Wed-
nesday by the House Appropriations
Committee.
The recommendations, repre-
senting an additional outlay of two
million dollars, were contained in
an \$82,305,945 appropriation bill fi-
nancing the legislative establish-
ment, judiciary and other agencies
for the fiscal year starting July 1.
They are expected to be approved
next week by the House.
No money for the Senate is now
provided in the bill. The Senate
will add its funds when the bill
reaches it.
Overall, the committee proposed
a total of \$28,946,995 for all operat-
ing expenses of the House. This is
\$3,587,720 more than provided in
the current fiscal year but \$751,510
less than original budget estimates
for this year.
For the federal judiciary, the
committee recommended \$27,479,-
950, a budget cut of \$1,065,555 but
an increase of \$1,249,430 above the
current year, due mainly to crea-
tion of 30 new judgeships.
