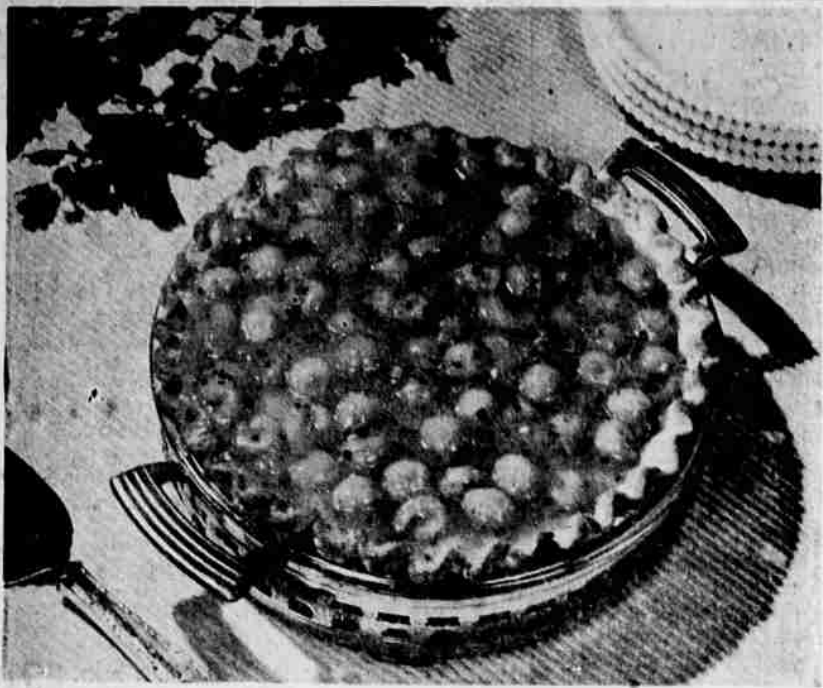




CELEBRATE gooseberry season with gooseberry cream pie. This photograph and tested recipe comes from the Evaporated Milk Association. Gooseberry desserts have been family favorites since pioneer days. The distinctive flavor of gooseberries is at its best in this fine gooseberry cream pie.

Gooseberries Are Not Old Fashioned

Fresh gooseberry time comes but once a year, so celebrate the season with this fine gooseberry cream pie. The nice plump berries are shown off to good advantage with the shiny glaze in this open face pie. Beneath the glazed berries is a layer of smooth cream filling. Its sweetness is a nice contrast to the tart berries and its fine texture makes it a joy to eat.

CREAM PIE
1 baked 9-inch pastry shell
3/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup cornstarch
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup boiling water
2 eggs
1 cup evaporated milk
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 recipe Gooseberry Glaze

Blend sugar, cornstarch and salt thoroughly in the top of the double boiler. Add water gradually, stirring to prevent lumping. Cook over direct heat until very thick, about 3 to 4 minutes, stirring all the while. Beat eggs slightly. Blend in milk. Remove cooked cornstarch mixture. Stir egg mixture gradually into cornstarch mixture. Cook over gently boiling water until mixture is smooth and thick, stirring frequently, about 8 to 10 minutes.

GOOSEBERRY GLAZE
2 1/2 cups gooseberries, washed, hulled and well drained
3/4 cup water
3 tablespoons cornstarch
1 cup sugar

Cook 1 1/2 cups of the gooseberries in the water until tender, about 3 to 5 minutes. Blend cornstarch and sugar thoroughly. Add to the hot mixture together with remaining gooseberries. Cook until glaze is thick and clear, about five minutes, stirring frequently but gently so as not to mash berries.

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DECORATION DAY

Decoration Day, now generally known as Memorial Day, in effect began in 1863 when the women of Columbus, Mississippi, placed flowers on the graves of both Union and Confederate soldiers. It was five years later that May 30 became the officially recognized day for decorating the graves of the soldier dead in the North. In North and South Carolina, Confederate Memorial Day is observed on May 10.

Your pastry brush can have a double use. Use it to get in between the blades, when you are washing your egg beater.

Mashing bananas for a cake or quick loaf? Slice bananas into a mixing bowl and use your pastry blender to break up the slices.

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NON-SKID HANGERS

Nylons and silks slide off hangers very easily. Rubber bands wrapped about the ends of the hangers will keep garments from slipping off.

Baking potatoes? Use a mealy, flaky variety of potato. When you are preparing scalloped or creamed potatoes, or a potato salad, choose the firm waxy variety that holds its shape.

BABY BOOTIES

To keep the shape of baby booties and woolen caps after washing, fill them with crushed tissue paper and let them dry.

A 10-inch narrow "ham" slicer is most useful. It may be used for slicing other cold meats besides ham, as well as for cutting cheese.
