QUESTIONS ASKED CANDIDATES FOR GOVERNOR

1. Are you in favor of any revision of the Oregon State constitution? If so, how?

2. Who do you believe should build and administer the major power dams in the Northwest?

3. Do you consider the State Board of Control an effective means of administration?

4. If tax revenues do not meet the needs of the state, what course of action would you recommend?

5. What is your plan to promote the diversification of Oregon industry?

JOSEPH K. CARSON, JR.

1. I favor a revision of the constitution of Oregon and have it contain (a) The state's general governmental structure and (b) The fundamental grants of power under which the people may directly or through the legislature enact laws for the common weal.

EARL T. NEWBRY

1. I believe in the sovereign rule of the people. The people now have the power to make any amendments and revisions to the Constitution which to them may seem necessary.

PAUL PATTERSON

1. I recommended to the 1933 Legislature that they submit to the voters the question of a constitutional convention.
