



ALTURA GARDEN CLUB
The Spring Flower Show sponsored by the Alturas Garden Club will be held Saturday May 29 in the social hall of Modoc Union High school. Doors will be open between 2 and 5 p.m. and 7:30 and 10:30 p.m.
The afternoon program and silver tea will start at 4 p.m. and the evening program will start at 8 o'clock.
The theme: "Come the spring with all its splendor. All its birds and all its blossoms. All its flowers and leaves and grasses."
1. Specimen: Worthy specimens not listed will be welcomed and will be considered for special ribbons.
Uniform containers will be furnished for all specimens by the club.

A—IRIS:
One specimen stalk of bearded or German Iris, named variety.
1. White
2. Yellow
3. Light Blue
4. Dark Blue
5. Red or Pink
6. Pleated
8. Blend
9. Purple
10. Collection of unnamed varieties.
11. Specimen stalk of bulbous Iris, named variety.
12. Specimen stalk of Siberian Iris, named variety.

B—PEONIES:
1. White, one blossom of named variety.
2. Pink, one blossom of named variety.
3. Red, one blossom of named variety.
4. White, one blossom of unnamed variety.
5. Pink, one or more blossoms of unnamed variety.
6. Red: One or more blossoms of unnamed variety.

C—LILACS:
1. Persian Lilac
2. French Lilac
3. Unnamed variety.
D—ROSES:
1. Climbers, named or unnamed.
2. Shrub Rose
3. Hybrid tea or Hybrid perpetual.
4. Floribunda or Polyantha

E—MISCELLANEOUS FLOWERS:
1. Oriental poppy
2. Delphinium
3. Columbine
4. Cettaurea
5. Dorotheum
6. Campanula
7. Fancies
8. Violets

H—Potted Plants:
A. Cacti
B. Begonias
C. Ferns
D. Geraniums
E. Coleus
F. Miscellaneous

III—Flower Arrangements:
A. May feature any cut plants and materials in interesting containers, with or without accessories.
B. Arrangement suitable for dinner table.
C. Arrangement suitable for luncheon (to be on card table furnished by exhibitor).
D. Arrangement suitable for breakfast.
E. Arrangement of shrub or tree blossoms.
F. Arrangements using native materials.
G. Arrangements featuring one color.

IV—Junior Flower Arrangements:
A. Small arrangements three inches to eight inches in height by child of six to twelve years of age.
B. Seasonal flowers in a bowl not to exceed 5 inches in width or height. Open to exhibitors 12 to 18 years of age.

RULES
1. Entries open to all amateurs.
2. Flowers in Section I and II must be grown by the exhibitor. Flowers used in sections III and IV need not be grown by exhibitors but must be home grown.
3. All persons entering exhibits must label each entry with correct name and furnish the clerk with a list of entries. Entry blanks will be provided.

4. All exhibits must be entered between 9 and 11 a.m. on Saturday May 27 at the small hall directly in front of the social hall of the high school. Eleven o'clock will positively be the deadline. No exhibit may be removed before 10:30 p.m. on Saturday but the hall will be open Sunday morning for the convenience of exhibitors who are unable to claim their exhibits Saturday night.
5. Garden club awards will be ribbons for best exhibits in each section and class as follows:
Blue ribbon, first.
Red ribbon, second.
Gold ribbon, special.
There will be special awards donated for special entries:
6—Special Entries
Anything pertaining to gardening, conservation, bird exhibits, corsages, sprays, wild flowers weeds or insecticides.
7. All entries will be placed by the staging committee. If the exhibit is an arrangement, the exhibitor may accompany her entry to give a final touch after it is placed.
8. The management will afford all possible protection for the exhibits but will not be held responsible for the loss of any property.
All containers and holders must be plainly marked with exhibitor's name on adhesive tape on the bottom of the container.
