### Army Games Simulate A-Bomb

YAKIMA (AP) The first of three simulated A-bombs scheduled to be exploded during the Army's exercise Hill Top was set off before dawn Thursday with theoretically devastating results.

After the 165-pound plastic phony was set off at 2,000 foot altitude, referees decided that 2,500 soldiers had been killed or put out of action and 48 tanks and 320 other wheeled vehicles reduced to impotence.

It was a theoretical victory by defenders over "aggressor" forces, over whom it was exploded after being dropped from a light airplane.

The pre-dawn was lighted for a moment by a 14,000,000 candle-power flash from the imitation bomb.

Two more are to be dropped before the exercise concludes.

### U.S. Plans Aid For Honduras

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras (AP) — The United States has agreed to give military assistance to Honduras as part of the program for the defense of the Western Hemisphere.

A military agreement was signed yesterday by Dr. J. Edgardo Valenzuela, foreign minister of Honduras, and U.S. Ambassador W. A. Willauer.

A similar agreement was signed recently by the United States and Nicaragua. Both Honduras and Nicaragua are between Red-tipped Guatemala and the Panama Canal.
