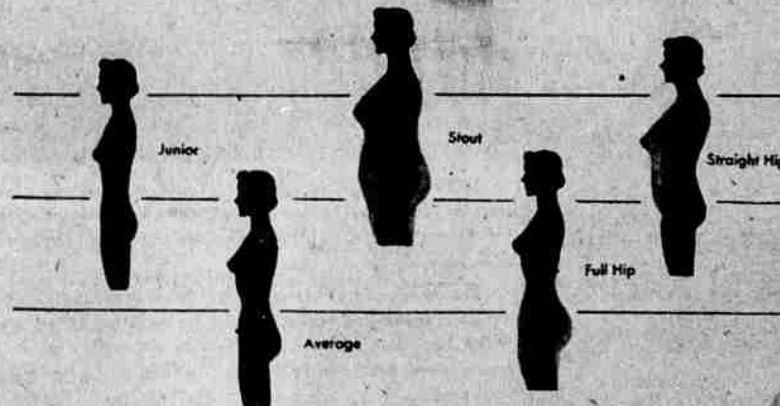
Mrs. H. Henniger was elected manager of the next year's convention in Medford.
