### Annual Poppy Sale Planned

Poppies, made by veterans who are in Veterans hospitals in Portland, Roseburg and at Camp White, will be sold by members of the American Legion Auxiliary, Friday and Saturday, May 28-29 as in other years.

The bright red paper blossoms serve a triple purpose. The flowers honor the war dead, they serve as occupational therapy in the hospitals, giving the disabled veteran an opportunity to help fill up long hours of the day with therapeutic activity, and the proceeds from the sale makes possible a broad program of rehabilitation and child welfare for hospitalized veterans and their families.

Material is furnished free of charge by auxiliaries over the state of Oregon. Following the sale of the small flowers, each veteran making poppies is paid two cents each, for those he completes. This provides a little spending money for the men, who otherwise have no way of earning funds.

When the veterans are paid, half of the remaining proceeds go to the state department to help with the extensive work done among hospitalized veterans, widows and orphans of veterans. The remaining half stays in the community where the poppies are sold and local auxiliary units carry on the same relief projects. Funds raised on these sales stay in the state of Oregon.

All over America auxiliary women give willingly of their time to sell these poppies before Memorial Day each year, reminding a grateful nation that there is still an obligation to veterans, living and dead, who have fought in American Wars.

There is no set price for a poppy. Those approached may contribute any amount to this worthy cause. Mrs. Katherine Keep, of the Klamath Falls Auxiliary Unit is the year's poppy sale chairman.

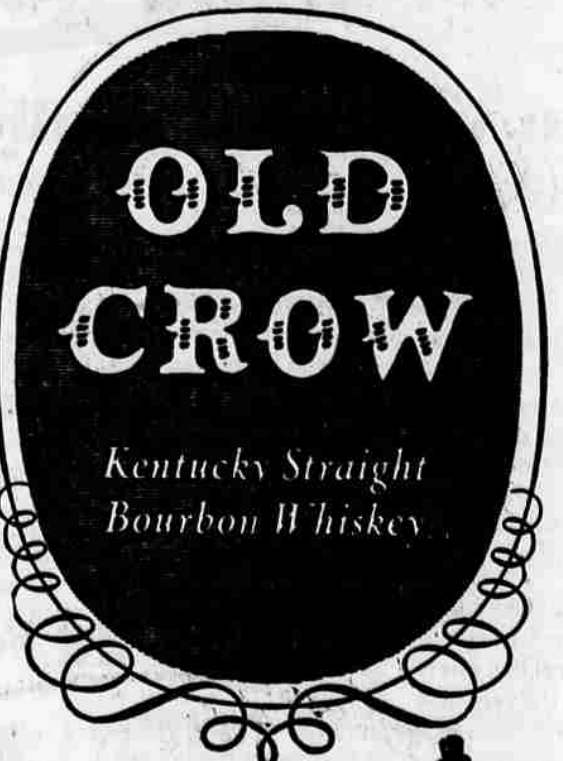
