

Two Youths Swept To Sea

COOS BAY (AP) — Avery Morgan, who was observing his 16th birthday, and a companion, Frank Collins, 16, were swept to sea from a rock while on a high school picnic at Sunset Bay Wednesday.

They were members of the sophomore class of Douglas High School at Dillard. Some 50 members of the class were at the coast for their annual outing.

Keith Ryder and Norman Malone, two other students, said they, Collins and Morgan, came upon a sharp rock while walking toward the entrance of the bay which is about 12 miles from here.

Ryder and Malone decided to walk around the back of the rock but Morgan and Collins started to climb around it on the seaward side.

Two big waves rolled in while they were behind the rock, Ryder said. When they got on the other side, Ryder and Malone saw their companions had been swept off the rock and were being carried out into the ocean by the outgoing tide. Three other students, Tom Weaver, Bud Glen and Ted Vale, also saw the pair swimming against the tide.

Malone ran back to notify the Coast Guard while Ryder tried to keep the pair in sight, but they disappeared when about 300 yards out.

The Coast Guard cutter Bonham and a plane from North Bend searched the area through the afternoon but both returned at night and the two youths were presumed

drowned.

This was the second time in a little more than a year that tragedy had struck the Collins family. His father, Forest Dean Collins, was one of four persons killed in a Roseburg airplane crash in March, 1953.

Frank Collins, swept to sea in the high school picnic tragedy at Coos Bay Wednesday, was the grandson of Mrs. Mattie Collins, 813 Pine Street and nephew of Mrs. Frank (Dorothy) Lowell, Midland Road, Mrs. D. R. (Ila) Cummings, 1818 Portland Street and Mrs. Harold Sturgeon, Summers Lane.

Frank had visited here many times. Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Frances Collins, a sister, Pearl, and a brother, Andy.

Mrs. Lowell left last night for Roseburg, the boy's home.

Nixon Urges Hearings End

NEW YORK (AP) — Vice President Richard M. Nixon says the Army-McCarthy hearings are diverting attention from more important issues, and the quicker they end the better.

He declared last night that the Eisenhower administration is "smashing the Communist conspiracy to bits" through efforts of Atty. Gen. Herbert Brownell and FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, without compromising American fair-play principles.

Addressing a \$100-a-plate New York State Republican Committee dinner, he did not mention Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R-Wis.) by name.

He said Brownell and Hoover are waging an anti-Red program of "action and not talk."

Secretary of health, education and welfare, and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey.

Dewey did not announce whether he would run for a fourth term this fall, as it had been expected he might, but delivered a campaign-type speech against Democratic state leaders and said the voters wanted the Republican administration.

Nixon said the hearings in Washington distracted attention from what he called the Eisenhower administration's "magnificent program" to achieve peace and prosperity.

Cold Damages Farm Crops

With temperatures reported as low as 20 degrees in various spots in the Klamath Basin last night, some damage to early crops is expected.

While it will take two or three days to determine the extent of damage done to Tulalake barley stands, some farmers are contemplating re-seeding, according to Cliff Jenkins, manager of the

Potato planting has been under way for some time but very few have been planted long enough to be up. Those that had peeked through the ground were blackened by the frost.
