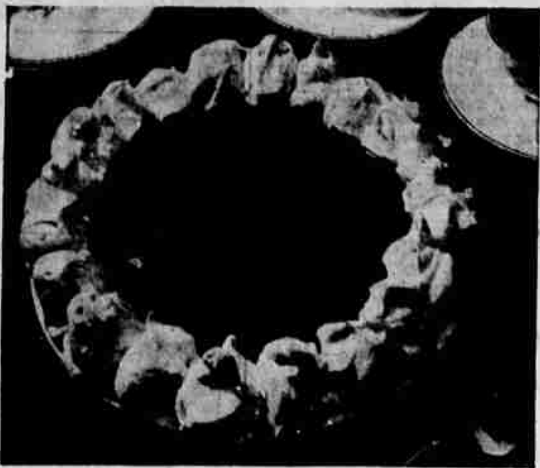


PUDDIN' PIE FIT FOR ROYALTY

3 egg whites
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 package instant chocolate pudding
Pinch of salt
¾ cup sugar

Beat the egg whites until stiff. Gradually add cream of tartar, salt and sugar, beating until stiff and satiny. Spread about two-thirds of meringue over bottom and sides of well-greased 8-inch pie plate. Drop remaining meringue by teaspoonfuls around rim of plate. Bake at 275 degrees (slow oven) one hour or until meringue is light brown and crisp. Cool on wire rack, away from drafts. Prepare Royal Instant Chocolate Pudding, following directions on package. Turn immediately into baked meringue shell. Chill until firm, about 1 hour.

River Flood Level Drops

BONNERS FERRY, Idaho (AP)—The Kootenai river continued to drop at a snail's pace Wednesday and was expected to keep up the slow rate of decline the rest of the week.

The river reached a level of 33.05 feet Wednesday morning, a drop of about .30 of a foot since Tuesday.

All the dikes were holding firm and the Army Engineers said about 15 of the 35 supervisory people here would be relieved.

"We feel the situation is pretty well in hand," said Lt. Col. L. L. Hall who is in charge of Army operations here.

The Weather Bureau said the Kootenai should drop to 32.9 feet here Thursday, 32.5 Friday and 32 on Saturday. At 32 feet it would still be a foot above the recorded flood level.

The river was up slightly Wednesday at Libby, Mont., to 14.5 feet but a decline was forecast there later in the day.

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Glamor Salads



MOLDED SHRIMP SALAD made with low-calorie lemon-flavored gelatin gives a new look to a diet luncheon — and is as satisfying as it is pretty. Brilliant shrimp in golden gelatin, with delicate green spring onions as an appetizer, make a combination that's pleasing to everyone — weight-watchers or not.

Here's a boon to dieters in the form of an attractive entree salad which uses only a small amount of the day's calories. Molded salads look like spring and are as appetizing and hearty a dish as any dieter could ask for.

The secret is the low-calorie fruit flavored gelatin which brings both flavor and intriguing color to the diet, but adds only 10 calories per serving. This dietetic product has long been popular for hospital and professional use and is now available in grocery stores. Here are two recipes, one for Shrimp Salad and one for Cherry Pineapple Mold both of them welcome variations to a dieter's menu.

SHRIMP SALAD

1 envelope (7 grams) low-calorie lemon-flavored gelatin
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup hot water
1 teaspoon vinegar
1 cup diced shrimp (or flaked tuna fish or diced crab-meat)
1 tablespoon chopped celery
1 tablespoon chopped green pepper

Dissolve gelatin and salt in hot water. Add vinegar; chill until slightly thickened. Then add fish, celery, green pepper and onion. Divide evenly into two individual ring molds. Chill until firm. Unmold on salad greens and garnish with whole shrimp and green onion. Makes one to one-thirds cups salad, or two or three portions.

CHERRY PINEAPPLE MOLD

1 envelope (7 grams) low-calorie lemon-flavored gelatin
1 cup hot water
2 tablespoons drained, pitted, quartered, unsweetened cherries
2 tablespoons drained, diced, cooked, unsweetened pineapple

Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Chill until slightly thickened. Then fold in fruit. Divide evenly into

two individual molds. Chill until firm. Serve plain or garnished with whipped cream, if allowed on diet. Makes two servings, about ¼ cup each.

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
